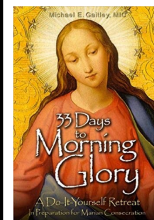

**STEER FOR THE DITCH**

Never learned that one in driver's education, did you? Steer for the ditch. Jesus tells of the Good Samaritan, a man who didn't worry about staying between the lines. He wasn't afraid to go into the ditch to help someone in need. While the scholar in the Gospel today is just full of "what ifs." He's trying to compartmentalize his spiritual life from his secular life. He only wants to have a relationship with God that is definitely between the lines, he wants to stay out of the ditch. Loving God with all your heart, being, strength, and mind is a totally different thing than loving your neighbor as yourself for the scribe.

Have we ever known anyone like that? Maybe we are thinking that loving God with all our heart, being, strength and mind is only for the time we sit in the pews of Holy Trinity and St. Gregory for one hour a week. Maybe we think that "loving our neighbor as ourselves" is a totally different thing. If that is what we are thinking, then it's our spiritual life, our relationship with Christ that is lying in the ditch, half dead, and in need of some serious first aid.

We like to compartmentalize our lives. Work is work, family life is family life and that is all good. But our spiritual life, our relationship with Jesus is something we should not, cannot compartmentalize. Christianity is a way of being, it should permeate every other aspect of our lives. Our Christian life is not something we turn on and off like a light switch.

Is this hard to do? You bet it is. It's very hard to combine the spiritual world with the secular world. However, we have to accept who we are, and what we are being called to do in this world. How do we love God with all our heart and mind, being, and strength and then love our neighbor as ourselves? We have to have a living relationship with Jesus. This means we have to take our spiritual life, we have to take all that time we spend in Church, all of the Rosaries we have prayed, and we have to take all the spiritual graces we have received from going to Mass and receiving the Eucharist and go down into the ditches of people's lives.

Jesus doesn't ask us to do more than what we are capable of doing. Being that Good Samaritan, going into the ditch of someone's life, can be as simple as listening to the old woman with dementia who approaches you and wants to talk to you for twenty minutes. Maybe it is letting someone get into a line of traffic at an event. For you young adults in high school, maybe it is just putting away your cell phones, giving your instructor your undivided attention, and not automatically dismissing what they tell you. Maybe your parents or children have fallen out of the habit of going to Sunday Mass, and you need to encourage them to go again.

You see, loving God and your neighbor requires action as well as prayer. These two things are intertwined with each other. Being a Good Samaritan is more than waiting for the opportunity to do a random act of kindness. It requires a genuine concern for others, and we have to intentionally meet the real needs of others in the name of Jesus Christ. So, as we drive through life, be like that Good Samaritan and go into the ditch once in a while.

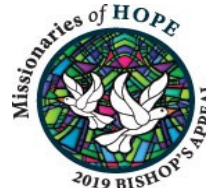
