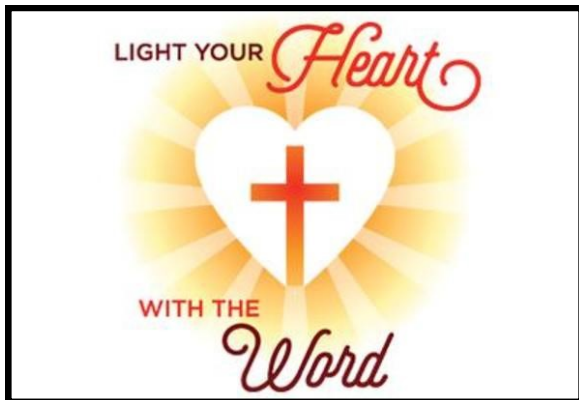

Pastoral Perspective ...



"BE VIGILANT"

The main message of the liturgy of the word for today's Mass is the necessity of trusting faith in God's promises and vigilant preparedness among the disciples of Jesus.

The first reading taken from the book of Wisdom tells us about the faith-filled preparedness of the ancient Hebrew slaves in Egypt before their mass exodus to the Promised Land. Their trusting faith in God's promises gave them hope. We were told how their faith and hope resulted to their liberation. With expectant hope, the Hebrews sacrificed the first Passover lamb and ate the first ritual meal as prescribe by God through Moses.

Today's Psalm invites us to express our own confidence in God and to declare our trust in his divine providence. In our second reading, St. Paul defines faith as "the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." He encouraged the Jewish Christians by appealing to the example of their ancestors, starting with Abraham, and narrating the things they had accomplished by their faith.

Jesus in the Gospel reading today, challenges us to be prepared at all times because the Son of Man may come at an unexpected hour, either at the moment of our death or at the end of the world. Using the master-servant parable, Jesus reminds us always to do the will of God by obeying his commandment of love and by offering humble and sacrificial service to others. Using the master-thief parable Jesus warns us to be on guard at all times.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, since we do not know when the Son of Man will come, we need to have strong faith that will help us to be ready and vigilant. Jesus says that we must "stand ready" at all times. We must be vigilant. If we knew the exact date the world will come to an end, most of us would stop committing sin. We would begin to be good, kind, prayerful, and very religious. All those things that we would do, if we knew the date, we should begin to do even when we do not know the date. We should begin to live the kind of life that we would like Jesus to find us living.

If we are told today that the world is going to end in the next 24 hours or that Jesus is coming in the next 24 hours, would we be able to say that we would continue doing exactly what we are doing, living the kind of life that we are living? If we can say that, then we are ready and vigilant. We have nothing to fear from the ancient robber, death. Death itself will be afraid of us.

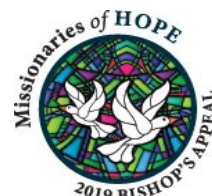
