Hear to Serve ...



Good Stewards

Who are we going to serve? Do we serve God or do we serve material wealth?

Most of us would be quick to say that we serve God. After all, we go to Mass, we contribute to the collection, and we participate in parish fundraisers. We make sure we do our part. Or do we?

God created every person in His image and likeness. However, He also created us as unrepeatable, unique individuals. Each one of us is here to have a personal relationship with God and a personal relationship with His Church. Each one of us has been given talents and gifts that are meant to be shared. We are to be good stewards of these gifts.

What does it mean to be a good steward? Jesus tells us in our Gospel reading from Luke that we are to be trustworthy in small matters. This sounds like an easy task. However, we need to really take stock of our lives. Think back to yesterday. Were you completely trustworthy in every dealing? Did you tell the truth or resort to that easy "white lie"? Did you go behind someone's back instead of confronting them? Did you join in the gossip or shut it down? Did you keep your commitment to daily prayer? Did you have a kind word for that person in front of us at the grocery store? Have you welcomed the stranger into your community? Have you reached out to those in need with your heart? These are small, unimportant matters to the world. But our actions in these small matters show the depths of our character. Our actions in small matters reflect who we really serve.

Sometimes, we do not like what we see in the mirror. It is so easy to get caught up in what our society views as acceptable. Jesus sets a different standard. We are to strive to live holy lives. Yes, it is possible to live a holy life. All it takes is making the next right decision. All it takes is one right choice at a time. Sounds easy, right? It isn't really. There is a lot of pressure from the outside. We have secret weapons, however. We have Jesus, who helps us when we fail. We have Mary who showed us what can happen when we cooperate with the plan God has for us. We have the saints who learned to trust that being holy is possible. We need to strive, not for a comfortable life or a comfortable parish, we need to strive for a life and parish that is 100% committed to serving Jesus and His Church.

Let us take it one day at a time. Make a commitment to God to be trustworthy in all of the small matters you are entrusted with today. Our youth and those who have fallen away from the Church are watching. They are looking for real examples of Christ's teachings in action. Let us be good stewards and make it a holy day.

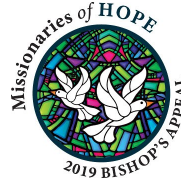
