Hear to Serve ...



THE DEACON'S RAMBLINGS

In Luke's Gospel this week we hear once again about Lazarus and the rich man. The rich man has everything and figures it is all his to keep. It is amazing, how throughout his life, the rich man continually used Lazarus as his door mat, stepping over him day after day. He really did not want to see Lazarus. We know that the rich man was well versed with Moses and the prophets, but he ignored their message. He was only interested in the gospel of himself.

Our Bishop has asked us to do the one by One Campaign. The Bishop is our Shepherd for the Diocese of Green Bay. He is trying to lead us, to guide us. We have to decide if we are going to take up the role of the rich man and not listen. Part of this campaign is giving us an opportunity to see the Lazaruses of the world, and to share the good we have with the less fortunate.

We, the people, are called to share the good in our lives with the Lazaruses of the world. Father Tony, your Deacon, the laity, the parish councils, down to the youngest altar server, are called to share the good in our lives. When we share our time, talents, and treasure, it is not for the good of the Diocese, or to make our Bishop or Father Tony look good, we do this ultimately for Jesus.

I know that the one by One Campaign has some of us in a tailspin. The first thing coming into our minds and off our lips is, "The Bishop wants more money. Is he crazy?" I understand these feelings. I have to work and pay bills just like all of you. Before we automatically close our minds, we should stop and remember that we don't always see the big picture. Just because Lazarus isn't literally on our doorstep doesn't mean he's not out there.

We just started the "one by One" Campaign and already wild rumors, and gossip have surfaced, along with a bitter taste in people's mouths. Yes, the Diocese is asking for money again, and it's not the first thing I want to hear either. Before we totally close off our minds, and hearts we have to do some things. We have to find out the truth about the campaign and how it really works. We must carefully read the literature about the campaign that is at the back of Church. Then, if we have questions about how the Diocese plans to use the funds and about the parish plans for the funds, then we must talk to Father Tony or come to a Parish Council meeting to hear the facts. We also have to PRAY before we make decisions.

Once you have all of the facts and have prayed about it, you may find that you wish to support the campaign. You may feel called to donate and/or to help as a volunteer to ensure the success of the parish and diocesan goals. On the other hand, you may decide not to participate. That is your decision, but please do not discourage other's participation.

Our Bishop really doesn't get excited about asking us for money, but he is doing his part by going out personally to raise money. He is getting his hands dirty with the rest of us. I ask of you to have faith in our Bishop, in our diocese, in our Pastor Father Tony, and in our Parish Councils. Yes, the one by One Campaign requires raising money, but it is really about increasing the ways in which we as a Diocese and parish can bring the message of Christ to the Lazaruses of this world. Doing the work of Christ is not always easy, and it is not always cheap.

Let us not be like the rich man who refused to see the poor and needy of the world. Let us take direction from our Bishop and share the good of our lifetime. Let us be generous in the sharing of our time, talent, and treasure, so we don't get caught stepping over the poor. We don't want to end up on the same side of chasm as the rich man.
