The Pastor's Perspective ...



THE JUST SHALL LIVE BY FAITH

The Gospel reading of today's Mass tells that true and matured faith is very important in our relationship with God. It is only true and matured faith that can help us to love and serve God unconditionally without counting the cost.

Faith is the greatest force in the world. It is to believe what we do not see. It is a leap into the unknown. It is a supernatural gift which God has given us that makes us to believe without doubting whatever God has revealed through the scriptures and the Church. Faith is a gift from God, given gratuitously, provided we are open to receive it. It is reliance not on self but on God.

As Jesus said in the Gospel reading of today, the tiniest bit of faith is enough so long as it is real faith. It means that even if our faith is small like the size of a mustard seed, it can remove mountains of difficulties, mountains of perplexities, mountains of sickness, mountains of sins. It means that faith can accomplish stupendous achievements.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, the quality of our faith is very important. Using the master-servant parable, Jesus teaches us that for our faith to be effective, it must be linked with trust, obedience, and total commitment - an active submission to God with a willingness to do whatever he commands.

God assures the prophet in our first reading today that faith is power, and hence, the just shall live righteous lives in the midst of encircling evil because of their faith. We need to enrich our faith through prayer, Bible study, participation in the Holy Mass and leading a well-disciplined spiritual life.

Only faith that is living and matured, like the mustard seed in the soil, will triumph over difficulties. A man of faith is a man of action, for he has within him the fountain of energy. Faith is given to us to enable us do great things that ordinarily we would not be able to accomplish. For with God all things are possible. If we have faith nothing would be impossible for us. The first reading of today tells us that the just shall live by their faith. We must have faith in God, for without faith no one can please God.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, as we continue with this Mass let us join the apostles in asking the Lord to increase our faith.

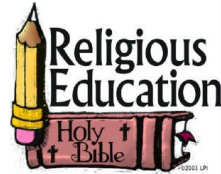
