Hear to Serve ...



MARRIAGE IN HEAVEN?

As we join Jesus this week, we see the Sadducees trying to trip Jesus up about there being a resurrection day for mankind. They posed the question about a widow marrying seven brothers successively after each brother dies. They want to know whose wife she will be at the resurrection. Jesus responds that "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die for they are like angels, and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise." There is a mouthful from Jesus.

The Sadducees didn't care about marriage. They were only trying to disprove Jesus on the question of life after death and the Resurrection itself. But this Gospel reading makes many of us think about whether marriage continues after we die because, unlike the Sadducees, we do believe in life after death. Will the love we have for each other continue after we die?

Well, to answer the question of marriage in heaven and to understand Jesus' answer, there are a few things we need to know first. Jesus said we will be "like angels" in heaven. Well, angels are pure intellect. They have no bodies, and they don't reproduce. Remember, Jesus said, "like Angels." He didn't say we will become angels. St. John Chrysostom said, "Angels have a friendship, a spiritual love and intimacy for each other borne in the presence of God." So, the love we will experience in heaven will transcend the physical love we experience on earth.

Jesus said we are children of God created by Him. The Baltimore Catechism tells us that, "God created us to know Him, to love Him, and to serve Him." This almost sounds like a slave-master relationship, but it's not that at all. To love, serve, and to know God are designed to bring us into His Divine. Our sole purpose in life on earth should be for us to live in a way that we will be able to one day see the Face of God, to be in His presence in Heaven. We should desire this above all else.

We also need to remember that the Sacrament of Marriage was created by God. Marriage was created for us on earth as our vocation, our way to serve God in this life and also as a way to serve each other. Jesus instituted this Sacrament as a bond between a man, a woman, and God. Married couples are to use this bond to help bring each other into heaven, into God's Divine love. In the Sacrament of Marriage, we work to ensure that our spouse attains what we desire most for ourselves, to be with God forever.

The Sacrament of Marriage is a gift for us in our earthly lives. There is no need for marriage in Heaven. We will still know and love others in Heaven, but our love will be a result of God's perfect Divine love. We will love each other as the angels do. We will all be in perfect communion.

So, our job is not to worry about being married in Heaven. It is to live out our marriage vocation on earth. When we put God first in our lives, we learn about the love and sacrifice necessary for a beautiful marriage on earth. This is just a small glimpse of the pure, intense loving relationship that awaits us in Heaven. We will be in perfect union with the God who made us.

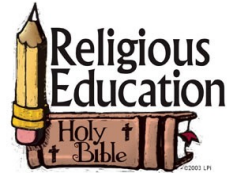

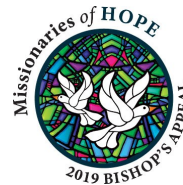

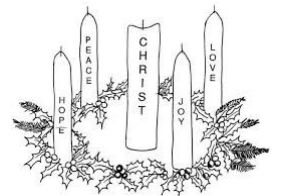
