Hear to Serve ...



"IMMEDIATE ACTION REQUIRED"

Have you ever gotten those mailings with "Immediate Action Required" stamped on the envelope? They are usually sent by some less-than-stellar company trying to scare us into buying some insurance or identity theft protection. Well, I hate to scare you, but Lent is right around the corner. Ash Wednesday is this week. Immediate Action is Required by all of us who haven't drawn up a plan to improve our spiritual growth this Lenten season. Don't wait until it is too late. Act now.

Lent is a time of preparation. The Church tells us it is a time for prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It is a time to renew ourselves spiritually, to clean out our minds, hearts, and souls of all the garbage that has accumulated over time. Because of Original Sin, mankind will always have a penchant for wandering over in the wrong direction of life. It's a constant battle for us. So, it is important to draw up our battle plans now and not wait until this Wednesday when Lent starts. Procrastination will slip in, and before we know it, Lent will be over.

Prayer. Our parishes offer the standards. Stations of the Cross followed by Benediction, Penance Services, and Masses on Sunday and during the week are wonderful ways for us to pray as a community. Lent is a good time to start saying the Rosary to stop abortion, and a great way for a family to pray together. Turn off the radio and start saying the Jesus Prayer on your way to work and home again. Read the daily Scripture readings which you can find on www.usccb.org. Spoiler Alert: You are also going to have a chance to get a prayer partner, use it.

Fasting. The Church asks that we abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. It also asks that we fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This Lent can be our time to do more than the bare minimum. Fasting is more than giving up a favorite comfort food. It can be giving up anything that gives us pleasure such as watching a TV show we like or binge watching. Maybe we go out every Saturday night for dinner. Instead, stay home, say the rosary, and take the money you would have spent for your almsgiving. You get the idea.

Almsgiving. Our parish provides us with the CRS Rice Bowl, a worthy project to say the least. Put one in your car to collect all that change you get from drive throughs and when you come out of stores. Support a local group such as the monks at Holy Resurrection Monastery who pray for us each day. Also, this would be a good time to re-evaluate our gifts to the Bishop's Appeal and our one-By-One Campaign and maybe offer a little something more into these worthy causes. Giving of your time is also part of almsgiving. Food pantries and hospitals are always looking for volunteers. Lent is the time to get out of your comfort zone and try a new ministry such as lector. Stop worrying about your fears. God will help you out.

Don't Delay. Draw up your Lenten plan to clean out your heart, mind and soul. Strengthen your self-control. Let's not drift aimlessly through another Lent. Bring yourself closer to Jesus and your Parish Family. Immediate Action is Required.

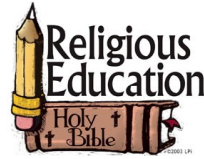

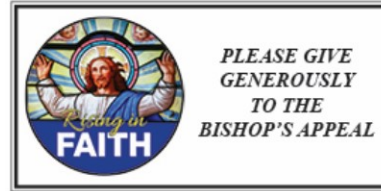
