Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: In her encounter with Jesus, we see a healing narrative arc for the woman at the well. She begins from a place of defensiveness; she knows what Jews usually think of Samaritans. She continues in a guarded manner, giving only a partial answer when asked about her husband. Deciding that this must be a prophet, she moves to challenge Jesus, asking intelligent questions to probe his wisdom. When he reveals to her his identity as Messiah, she finally arrives in a place of trust—such trust that she leaves her water jar behind and becomes a powerful evangelist, her testimony the cause of many neighbors' belief. Such is the power of encounter with Christ; one who is known to be sinful, who slinks to the well in the heat of the day to avoid the crowds of cooler times, is transformed into one whose testimony is so powerfully true that the same townspeople who would have judged her are transformed, too.

To Experience: Our physical thirst is only an echo of the way in which our hearts are meant to ache for God. Our need for God is infinite, for it takes an infinite God to satisfy the need. That means that our capacity is infinite. We are made for so much more than we realize.

1. How do you experience desire for God?
2. How does the Samaritan woman's encounter with Jesus compare to your own moments of encounter with him?
3. How does God speak to you? Where might you need to open your ears to hear him more clearly?
4. After her encounter with Christ, the Samaritan woman became a powerful witness whose testimony brought others to believe. To whom in your life could you be a witness of the love of God?

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)* offers this beautiful reflection about today's Gospel:

"If you knew the gift of God!"¹ The wonder of prayer is revealed beside the well where we come seeking water: there, Christ comes to meet every human being. It is he who first seeks us and asks us for a drink. Jesus thirsts; his asking arises from the depths of God's desire for us. Whether we realize it or not, prayer is the encounter of God's thirst with ours. God thirsts that we may thirst for him (CCC #2560).

Every religion in the world searches for God. Only Christianity dares to say that God is searching for us. In the Garden of Eden, Adam and Eve were hiding from God because they were ashamed of their sin. However, God came searching for them and called out, "Where are you?"²

The woman in today's Gospel reading has every reason to believe that God does not love her. She is a Samaritan, and the Samaritans were despised by the Jews. She was divorced many times and was not married to the man with whom she was living. This is why she was fetching water at noon, that is the hottest part of the day. She was ashamed. So she was coming to the well when she thought no one else would be there. Yet, someone was there waiting for her. There she met Christ, who desired not only a drink of water to slack his thirst, but much more desired that this woman would drink the waters of eternal life.

Christ has the same desire for you that he had for this woman. He searches for us. And wants us to drink the waters of eternal life. Like Adam and Eve, we can hide from God. We can avoid him by losing ourselves in distracts and being busy bodies. But what is Christ asking from us?

During this Lent, set aside whatever distracts you from spending quiet time with Christ. Be still. Be silent. And let Christ approach you in prayer. In the silent stillness, we will hear the voice of Christ speak to us, and if we are willing to listen, like this woman, we too will be filled with an excited joy that comes from knowing and loving Jesus.

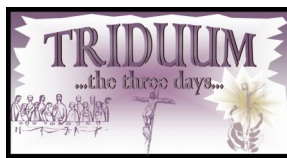
May you meet Christ, and may He set your hearts on fire!

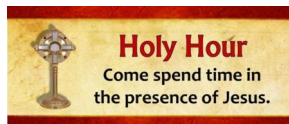

During this intensive experience, attendees will receive the vision, formation, and practical knowledge for how to carry out the process of spiritual multiplication. Thanks to the **generosity of the Bishop's Appeal**, this retreat is **free of charge** for staff, volunteers, and parishioners within the Diocese of Green Bay.

In his Letter to Timothy, Paul exhorts Timothy to practice spiritual multiplication. He writes, "And what you have heard from me through many witnesses entrust to faithful people who will be able to teach others as well." (2 Tim. 2:2). In other words, teach teachers to teach. This is where the word "Entrust" comes from.

What is the Timeframe?

- One-and-a-half-day version: This will consist of a Friday evening, followed by a full day of formation on Saturday.
- Three-day version: Each Entrust Retreat day will begin at 8am and end by 4pm, Monday through Wednesday. There will be options for overnight accommodations if needed.

What resources will I receive?

All attendees will receive a Missionary Discipleship curriculum that they can apply in their lives and ministries.

What happens after Entrust?

After Entrust concludes, you can expect an opportunity for accompaniment so that the Entrust team can support you in this process.

Is there a cost for Entrust?

At this time, due to the generosity of the Bishop's Appeal there is no cost for attending Entrust. All materials and meals are included.

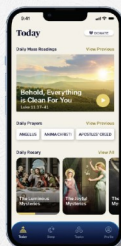

A three-legged stool to lean on for Lent

Have you ever used a tripod to take a photo? What happens if you remove one leg?

Oh, you can hold the camera upright on two or even one leg, but your shots will get mighty shaky.

It's the same way with Lent, and what are commonly called "the three pillars of Lent."

These three pillars — or practices — keep things "steady" for you as you make the journey from Ash Wednesday to the renewed life of Easter.

On Ash Wednesday, in the Gospel (Mt 6: 1-6; 16-18), Jesus laid out these three pillars: almsgiving, prayer and fasting.

FRANKLY, FRANCIS



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In our continuing catechesis on apostolic zeal, the desire to share with others the joy of the Gospel, we now consider the calling of the twelve apostles, whom Jesus chose "to be with him and to be sent out to proclaim the Good News" (Mk 3:14). Both aspects of that call are essential, for only by closeness to Jesus do we learn to proclaim him and not ourselves, his word and not our own. As Jesus sends the apostles forth on mission, he tells them to share the gift that they themselves received, the unmerited gift of God's redeeming love. Their message must be his own: that the kingdom of God is at hand and requires only that we receive it with open hearts. Jesus also tells the apostles that they are sent forth like sheep among wolves, to propose the Gospel above all by their witness of meekness, innocence and personal conviction, proclaiming Christ more by their actions than by their words. The Church, as "apostolic", is entirely missionary; each of us, in Baptism, is called by Jesus to live in closeness to him and to be sent forth, in union with all our brothers and sisters, to bear witness to his Gospel before the world.

Sunday TV Mass offers outreach to the homebound

GREEN BAY — On March 22, 2020, "Sunday Mass with Bishop David Ricken" debuted on WFRV Local 5. Green Bay's CBS affiliate chose to add the 30-minute ad-free program to their Sunday morning lineup as individuals and families

remained home due to COVID-19 restrictions. The intention was for Bishop Ricken to pray with the faithful weekly until the public could return to Mass in person.

Three years later, the Sunday Mass broadcast continues, with its focus now on serving those unable to be physically present at Mass.

Bishop Ricken encourages the diocese's faithful to participate in Mass in person every Sunday. And, as he does, various parishes are seeing a response in their ministry efforts and in-person Mass attendance.

Three top Irish saints

- 3** Brigid is also called Brigit, Bride or "Mary of the Gael, because of her Gaelic background. Her feast day is Feb. 1. She died in 525 at Kildare, Ireland.
- 4** The third saint is Columba, also called Colmcille or Colum, an abbot and missionary. He is also honored in Scotland, where he died on June 9, 597.
- 5** All three have famous symbols: the shamrock (Patrick), the dove for Columba, and "St. Brigid's (straw) Cross."

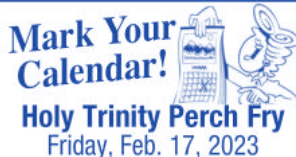
