Thoughts for Today's Readings


To the Point: Finally comes the moment for which the last weeks have prepared us. Jesus is going away, at least in one sense: the disciples will not have his bodily

presence to which they have become accustomed. He gives them their mission for while he is away: to make disciples, to baptize, to teach all that Jesus has taught. This will be the ongoing work of the church, work that continues even today. And Jesus does not leave the disciples—or us—alone in this work. Many of our Easter season readings have prepared us for this moment. He remains present in the breaking of the bread; he has promised the Holy Spirit as guide and companion. He is with us always, never leaving us alone, even when the life of faith is a struggle.


To Experience: Each of us is called to share in the evangelizing work that Christ entrusts to the disciples here. For laypersons, it is not always apparent how we are making disciples or teaching the faith or leading others to baptism. But opportunities abound and every relationship is a chance to make Christ more present to someone, baptized or not, who might not know him well.

- Do you feel Christ's presence with you? In what ways is it easy or hard to trust?
- 2. How do you feel when you imagine Christ's return to earth? What do you still need to do to be ready for it?
- 3. In the gospel, Jesus gives his disciples three tasks for while he is away: They are to make disciples, to baptize, and to teach all that Jesus has taught. This is now the ongoing mission of the church. In what ways do you participate in these tasks?

The Lord has risen! He has truly risen!

It is hard to believe that it's almost the end of the Easter Season, and soon we will not be using that greeting anymore. But the end of the Easter Season draws our attention to a number of important Catholic feasts, and for me personally, it's also close to my birthday.

This Sunday is the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord. Next Sunday is the celebration of Pentecost, followed by Trinity Sunday a week later. Since this is the patronal feast of the church in School Hill, there will be a special breakfast after the 8:00 am Mass to make the occasion especially festive. Lastly, my favorite Sunday of the whole year, the Feast of Corpus Christi.

It was in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament that my Catholic Faith was set on fire, and drawing close to our Lord present in the Eucharist in the tabernacles of our churches never fails to renew my energy. In 2011, I was ordained the day before Corpus Christi, so my first Mass as a priest was on the Sunday of Corpus Christi. The Eucharist is a dear love of mine, and I wish to share that love with you.

At Bishop Ricken's request our parishes will be reviving the practice of the Corpus Christi procession this year. Starting this weekend, and each weekend until Corpus Christi, the bulletin will have information about the Corpus Christi procession.

Now it's not really my style to talk about my birthday in the bulletin column, but a number of people have already asked me about it, so I will provide you with two of my birthday wishes.

My first wish is that the Corpus Christi procession has large and enthusiastic participation.

My second wish is that we really take seriously the obligation to pray daily. I hope that when I am called to my next parish (and I have no clue when that will be) that the next priest is overwhelmed by the number of people in these parishes who have deep prayer lives. I encourage you to consider going on an Entrust Retreat. They are free. Don't buy me any books for my birthday, but buy yourself a book about prayer. I have two to recommend: Prayer for Beginners by Dr. Peter Kreeft. and Prayer Primer by Fr. Thomas Dubay. If you do not already pray the Rosary, pray a Rosary for me on my birthday. If you do not already read scripture, begin with the first chapter of the Gospel of Matthew on my birthday, and continue with a chapter a day until you have read all four Gospels.





Corpus Christi Celebration June 11, 2023 9am Mass at St. Gregory Parish Procession to Follow

Frequently Asked Questions About Eucharistic Processions

Starting in 2023, the Most Reverend David L. Ricken, Bishop of Green Bay, is highly encouraging each parish in the diocese to offer a Eucharistic Procession as part of the celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. Bishop Ricken would like Eucharistic Processions to be an annual celebration at each of the parishes in the Diocese of Green Bay.

Since Holy Trinity Parish and St. Gregory Parish share a priest, they will also be sharing a celebration of Corpus Christi and a procession. This year Corpus Christi falls on Sunday, June 11. There will not be 8:00 AM Mass at Holy Trinity. There will not be 10:00 AM Mass at St. Gregory.



Instead, there will be one Mass at 9:00 AM at St. Gregory, followed immediately by the Eucharistic Procession around the village of St. Nazianz. Next year, Holy Trinity will host the Mass and Procession.

Both parishes have a rich tradition of Corpus Christi processions. It is thought that the first local Corpus Christi procession was held in St. Nazianz in 1855. These continued as annual celebrations until at least 1976. The traditional procession route started at St. Gregory Church, passed through the settlement, continued south to the JFK Prep property, and returned though the woods to the parish church. This year's procession will be much shorter. Historic pictures show that at its height, the procession was nearly a mile long. Less is known about the Eucharistic Procession held in School Hill, but their celebration is well attested to by the numerous pictures in the parish archives.

Following are some frequently asked questions about the Corpus Christi procession:

What does "Corpus Christi" mean?

The words "Corpus Christi" mean "Body of Christ" and are another name for the "Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ" celebrated on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday. This solemnity marks with particular emphasis the doctrine of Christ's real presence—body, blood, soul, and divinity—in the Eucharist.

What is a Corpus Christi procession?

A Corpus Christi procession usually begins after the celebration of Mass, at which the host for the procession is consecrated. Placed in a monstrance (a sacred vessel that displays the sacred host to the faithful), the Blessed Sacrament is then carried out of the church and through the streets of the city or neighborhood accompanied by the songs and prayers of the people. Often there are altars decorated along the route where the monstrance is placed and the people are blessed. In this way the Church shows that Christ, here among us, walks with us on our pilgrimage to heaven.

What are the origins of the Corpus Christi procession?

The Corpus Christi procession and many of the other Eucharistic devotions seem to have begun in the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. These devotions responded to a multitude of factors, among which were a greater appreciation and understanding of Christ's Eucharistic presence and a desire to express this truth outwardly. Influencing the rise in Eucharistic devotions were the visions of an Augustinian nun, Juliana of Liège, in 1209 that indicated an annual celebration devoted to the Body of Christ should be added to the Church's calendar. In 1264, Pope Urban IV, who had resided in Liège prior to his becoming Pope and was familiar with Juliana's visions, established the feast of the Body of Christ for the entire Church. St. Thomas Aquinas (d.1274) is said to have composed the liturgical texts for this new feast, as well as the hymns "O Salutaris Hostia" and "Tantum Ergo" which are still sung today.


What is the relationship of the Corpus Christi procession to the Mass?

The Corpus Christi procession and all other Eucharistic devotions must be understood as being rooted in the celebration of the Mass. One basic principle for every Eucharistic devotion is that they "must have an intrinsic reference to the Eucharistic Sacrifice, dispose the faithful for its celebration, and prolong the worship which is essential to that Sacrifice" (Directory on Popular Piety, n.161). The celebration of the Eucharist, in the words of Pope Benedict XVI, "is itself the Church's supreme act of adoration" (Sacramentum Caritatis, n.66). Seen in this way, Eucharistic devotions and the Mass complement one another and are not in competition with each other.

Why should we participate in the Corpus Christi procession?

"The annual procession on the feast of Corpus Christi...has a special importance and meaning for the pastoral life of the parish or city.... When the Eucharist is carried through the street in a solemn procession with singing, the Christian people give public witness of faith and devotion toward the sacrament" (HCWEOM, nos. 101, 102). Says Pope John Paul II, "The devout participation of the faithful in the Eucharistic procession on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is a grace from the Lord which yearly brings joy to those who take part in it" (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, n.10). He continues: "In the humble signs of bread and wine, changed into the body and blood, Christ walks beside us as our strength and our food for the journey, and he enables us to become, for everyone, witnesses of hope" (n.62).




