#### **Thoughts for Today's Readings**

To the Point: It can come as a surprise, even for those of us who are attentive to the cycle of readings, that the Pentecost narrative is not today's gospel. Instead, we have a preliminary passing on of the Holy Spirit at another Easter encounter story. In this one, Jesus' breath is the means of transmission, a gentler image than the driving wind and tongues of fire we associate with this day. The Pentecost story we might expect here occurs only in Acts, and thus remains in the position of first reading. This reminds us that Pentecost is removed enough from the life of Jesus that it does not appear in the gospels. This story is about what the church will do now that Jesus' bodily presence has left the earth. And what it does is run out and preach, unable to contain the good news of Jesus.

**To Experience:** All of us are part of some culture or another. "Culture" does not just mean racial or ethnic background but includes things like our age, our social location, and even the microcultures of each of our families. The Holy Spirit can and does work through all of these, but the Pentecost story makes clear that we are also called to a unity that transcends them.

- Jesus promises peace in the gospel. Where in your life do you need the peace of Christ?
- 2. Name the cultures of which you are a part, remembering that "culture" here can be as small as family culture and can include things like age, profession, and social location. What aspects of your culture do you find limiting when it comes to preaching the gospel? How might the Holy Spirit be inviting you to overcome these divisions?
- 3. The second reading reminds us that the Spirit unites us as one body. What role do you play in the Body of Christ? How do you need others to support you?

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Come Holy Spirit! Fill the hearts of your faithful!

This Sunday is the celebration of Pentecost. The name simply means fifty, since it is celebrated on the fiftieth day after Easter. It is the celebration of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples who were gathered with Mary in the upper room.

Have you experienced the outpouring of the Holy Spirit? If you have been baptized and confirmed, you have received the Holy Spirit, whether you realize it or not. But even though Catholics have received the Holy Spirit sacramentally, most Catholics are uncertain about how the Holy Spirit acts in their life. The Pentecostal Denomination places a great emphasis on the more dramatic gifts of the Holy Spirit. Within the Catholic Church, the Charismatic Renewal has a similar focus. Most Catholics have not had these dramatic experiences, and as a result, doubt about the power of the Spirit in their lives. But the Bible is clear that the greatest gifts of the Spirit are supernatural Faith, confident Hope, and agape Love. These gifts are often present, even when they are not expressed in a dramatic way.

Many Catholics were never taught that they should be asking for the gifts of the Holy Spirit. If they do not know to ask for the Spirit, how will they receive it?

At different points in my life, I have participated in Catholic charismatic prayer groups. I have witnessed these dramatic gifts in person. They are real. They are powerful. And they can change lives. But usually, I experience the gift of the Spirit during times of silent and meditative prayer. The gifts of the Spirit are just as real, just as powerful, and just as transformative, even when they come silently.

How can we tell if we have received the Spirit? Jesus says in the Gospel of Matthew, "You will know them by their fruit." And this is the test about whether the Spirit is present: Does this experience lead me to a closer relationship with God and a holier life? If it does, it is of the Spirit. If it does not, it is not of the Spirit.

I have been praying for a renewed outpouring of the Spirit on these parishes. At Mass during the Eucharistic Prayer, there are two times that the priest calls down the Holy Spirit. The calling down of the Holy Spirit is called the EPICLESIS. The first time is over the gifts, the priest extends his hands over the bread and wine, the server rings the bells, and the words are pronounced: "Therefore, O Lord, we humbly implore you: by the same Spirit graciously make holy these gifts..."

The second time is not as clear, but it is equally present. It is the *EPICLESIS* over the people. After the consecration, the priest continues the Eucharistic Prayer, and calls down the Spirit on the people with these words, "...filled with the Holy Spirit, [we] may become one body, one spirit in Christ. May he make us an eternal offering to you..."

Just as the Spirit is called down upon the gifts of bread and wine, that they may be transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ, so the Spirit is called down upon you, that you may become a member of the Mystical Body of Christ, that is the Church.

Today, we hear how the Spirit came down as tongues of fire. May the Spirit set your life and faith on fire starting today.

# Eucharistic Procession Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ "Corpus Christi" Celebration

# June 11, 2023 9am Mass at St. Gregory Parish

"The procession with the Blessed Sacrament... reminds us that we are called to go and bring Jesus to others. To go with enthusiasm, bring Christ to those we meet in our daily lives," Pope Francis, homily on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, June 6, 2021.

There will be only one Mass on the morning of Sunday, June 11. It will be at St. Gregory Church at 9:00 AM.

A Eucharistic Procession, just like Eucharistic Adoration, is an extension of the worship of Jesus Christ, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. The supreme act of adoration and the source and summit of the Christian life is the celebration of the Mass, and that celebration is prolonged and intensified through Eucharistic worship outside of the Mass. In Eucharistic Processions, the missionary aspect of the Eucharist is emphasized as we go forth into the world. Not only gazing upon our Eucharistic Lord, but walking with him, we experience what the disciples did 2000 years ago as they walked with Jesus, proclaiming the Good News to the world.

A parish community that undertakes a Eucharistic Procession has made a decision to publicly proclaim its belief in Jesus' True Presence in the Eucharist. By this public witness of faith, the parish invites people in the community to encounter the Risen Lord present in the Eucharistic Host. For those who participate in the procession, it is an opportunity not only to proclaim their faith but also to grow in their faith. The procession is, finally, an invitation to Jesus himself to be a part of our daily lives, to be immersed in the world in which we live.
