### Thoughts for Today's Readings

**To the Point:** In this gospel, Jesus is reassuring the disciples, for he has just revealed that their mission of preaching and healing will also lead them into the path of persecutions and hatred. In this passage, he reminds them at least three times not to be afraid. Their mission is true and trustworthy and worth the pain it will bring. More importantly, they do not go alone; they are accompanied always by a God who knows all and sees all and loves them intimately. The image of God seeing and noting the deaths of even sparrows is a charming one; sparrows are referred to by birders as "little brown jobs," interesting in their own way but nondescript, good at camouflage, and hard to tell apart. We know now of their ecological importance, but on the surface they are not the most interesting bird there is to see. But God sees and notices each of them individually, and God's care for us is many orders of magnitude more.

**To Experience:** In the contemporary Western world, Christians often do not face the sort of persecutions encountered by the disciples. For us, courageous faith is still needed but occurs in much more subtle ways: in standing up for truth in a conversation with a loved one, in treating those with love whose choices might make us uncomfortable. Wherever and whenever we need courage, God goes with us, seeing our fears and accompanying us through them.

1. Have you experienced suffering because of your faith in Jesus? What was it like?
2. How does your suffering compare to that of the early church?
3. Where in your life do you need an increase in courage?

**Year of Mary**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Recently, our parishes joined together for a Eucharistic Procession. That experience will be a highlight of my ministry here. The participation in the procession exceeded my expectations and was very encouraging for me as a priest. Thank you! I am already looking forward to the procession next year.

During the procession we sang "Godhead Here in Hiding" a hymn by St. Thomas Aquinas, translated by the great English poet and priest, Fr. Gerard Manley Hopkins. It is a Catholic classic, and such a beautiful summary of what we believe about the Eucharist, that I hope it becomes a regular part of our worship here. Here are the lyrics of the first verse:

"Godhead here in hiding whom I do adore  
 masked by these bare shadows, shape and nothing more  
 See, Lord, at thy service low lies here a heart  
 Lost, all lost in, wander at the God thou art."

The word hiding in the first line recalls this Sunday's Gospel. Jesus speaks to the apostles, "Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed..." What was being concealed? In a certain sense, Jesus' divinity, that is his status as "God from God, light from light, true God from true God." During the 33 years that Jesus lived here on earth, anyone who saw him would have seen his humanity: the infant son of Mary, the foster child of Joseph, a carpenter, an itinerant preacher, even a wonder-worker. They would not have seen his glory as the Son of God directly. His godliness was "hiding" in a sense within his manliness.

So, it took faith for the apostles to confess that Jesus was Lord.









Yet, at the time appointed by God, the glory of the Lord was revealed. Was it not a centurion at the crucifixion that was the first to confess, "Truly this man was the Son of God" (Mark 15:39)? Or Thomas that confessed on the eighth day after the Resurrection, "My Lord and my God" (John 20:28)? It was through his death and resurrection that the apostles were able to see that Jesus was not only a carpenter or a preacher, but that he was truly the Messiah for which their hearts longed.

We live and believe in similar circumstances as the apostles. Jesus dwells with us. In fact, the word tabernacle means the dwelling place. He dwells with us, not incarnationally, that is in the flesh, like he did with the apostles, but rather sacramentally. He's truly and really present in the sacrament of the Eucharist. Like the apostles, we cannot see his glory directly. He is "Godhead here in hiding." But like the apostles, we can make an act of faith. They saw a carpenter or a preacher, but by faith, they recognized their Lord and God. We see bread and wine, but by faith, we can recognize our Lord and God, Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

While for the apostles, Jesus was present in the flesh, and for us he is present in the sacrament, it is the same Jesus. As Jesus taught the apostle, time spent before the Eucharist often brings us enlightenment. As Jesus healed the sick, the Eucharist heals us spiritually. As Jesus fed the five thousand, the Eucharist feeds us at the level of our deepest hungers. As Jesus raised the dead to life, the Eucharist is truly our "Bread of Life," and "all who feed on this bread will live forever" (John 6:58).

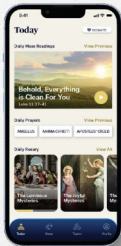

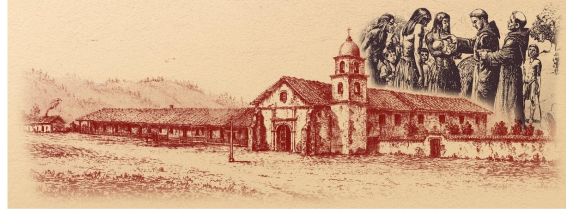

### Get to Know Deacon Ben

**Are there any books that you love so much that you have read them twice (or more)?** I have read "The Lord of the Rings" by J.R.R. Tolkien twice, and I am ready to read it again!

**When you find yourself with a "free night," what is something you are likely to do?** I am likely to spend some time with friends. Otherwise, I will read a book, play guitar, or watch a movie.

**What do you remember from your First Communion?** I remember that my First Communion was on April 26, 2003. I wore the same blue suit that my brother did for his First Communion. While I do not remember very much from the Mass, I remember having a great celebration and receiving a lot of gifts. Looking back now, I understand why we had such a big celebration!

**Where is one of your favorite places to pray, and what makes it special to you?** One of my favorite places to pray is the Sacred Heart Chapel in the Holy Name of Jesus House of Formation in Allouez. Even though I never participated in the Kairos Year, that chapel is very special to me. It is just the right size for

personal prayer and often smells of incense. There is a lot of beauty packed into that chapel: the golden tabernacle, the Sacred and Immaculate Heart statues, and the handmade woodwork lift my mind and heart to God. Anytime I have the chance, I stop to pray in the Sacred Heart Chapel.

**What role has the Eucharist played in your discernment of the priesthood?** The Eucharist played a huge role in my discernment of the priesthood. Well before I considered the priesthood, I loved the Eucharist. I loved Jesus in the Eucharist. That being said, the first time I really felt called to the priesthood, the Blessed Sacrament was before me. After I experienced that call, I spent a lot of time in prayer before the Eucharist to continue discerning if the call was really from God. During my discernment I attended daily Mass. Every day I heard the Eucharistic prayer spoken on the lips of the priest. Every day I received Jesus from the hands of a priest. The priesthood and the Eucharist are absolutely inseparable. Thus, as I grew closer to the Eucharist, I felt more drawn to the priesthood as well. As I receive the sacrament of holy orders, I hope to imitate Jesus in the Eucharist by giving myself completely to God's people each and every day.
