

### Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: In this gospel, Jesus calls himself the good shepherd, and his descriptions of this role make clear that having a shepherd like Jesus is not like be-

ing a sheep raised for wool or meat. No matter how tenderly shepherds care for their flock, it is an inherently utilitarian relationship. But having a good shepherd like ours is about being known and being loved. We are so loved that there is one willing to lay down his very life for us. Having a good shepherd is also about knowing the shepherd in turn. We may not always feel like we know Jesus, who often moves in subtle and mysterious ways. But we are promised that we have a home in him, and whenever our hearts stir with the recognition that we are known and loved, we can be assured that Jesus is there.

**To Experience:** Sheep are raised by shepherds either for wool or meat. They give of themselves (although unknowingly) to provide warmth and nourishment for others. We, the sheep of our Good Shepherd, are also called to give of ourselves in order to provide shelter and nourishment for others. We are asked to extend the love that Jesus offers to us and to care for others as our shepherd cares for us.

- 1. What does the image of Jesus as good shepherd mean to you?
- 2. Where do you most clearly recognize Jesus in your life? What makes your heart stir with recognition that you are known and loved?
- 3. How can you extend Jesus' loving care to others in your life?

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear the words of Jesus, "I am the Good Shepherd." I find these words difficult this year. I have been your shepherd for nearly three years, and now I am being sent to be a shepherd for

another parish.

I am given comfort by recalling my first words to you when I arrived in October 2021. I started with a question: "Who owns this parish?" Is the parish owned by the priest? Or is it owned by the people? Both answers are wrong.

Christ owns the parish. It is His Word that we hear proclaimed every Sunday. It is His Body and Blood that we receive in the Eucharist every Sunday. And it is on His mission that we are sent out at the end of Mass, "Go and glorify the Lord by your life."

Éven though I am being moved, Christ will remain here to be your Shepherd.

The Gospel passage for this Sunday also talks about hearing the voice of Christ. Are we listening for His voice? What is He telling us? And where is He leading us?

If we are a people of prayer, especially meditative and contemplative prayer, He will lead us. And if we respond to His voice, and go where He leads, He will lead these parishes to green pastures and flowing waters.

There is anxiety about having an international priest. But even in this, Christ wants to teach us, lead us, and feed us. Here is some of what I have been hearing Christ speak to my heart in prayer:

"I was a stranger and you welcomed me" (Matthew 25:35b). As anxious as we are about having an international priest, he is probably just as nervous about being sent on mission to serve us. How are we preparing to welcome him as a brother in Christ? Are we grateful that he is willing to leave home and family, and everything that is familiar and comfortable to come and serve us?

"The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few" (Matthew 9:37b). There really is only one reason why we are dependent on international priests: there are not enough men becoming priests. Are we determined in our prayer and spiritual sacrifices to beg God to raise up priestly vocations from our own parishes and our own families? Are we encouraging our own sons, grandsons, and nephews to consider a call to the priesthood?

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment" (Matthew 22:37-38). What is the reason that we are coming to church? Some priests are more gifted. Some are less gifted. Some priests are easy to understand. Some are more difficult to understand. I hope that you are not coming to church for the priest, rather I hope that you are coming to church for Christ. Last week, I wrote about how I was warmly welcomed here. Over the last two weeks, I have received numerous notes of appreciation. All of this deeply touches my heart, and will make it all the more difficult to depart. However, the greatest gift that you can give me is if you can truly say that you are closer to Jesus and love Him more now then when I first arrived.

We continue to keep each other in prayer.

### **UPDATED STIPEND & STOLE FEE STRUCTURE**

The diocese and our parishes are grateful to all those who have generously provided a donation for Masses, Funerals, Weddings and Quinceaneras in the past. The donation for these sacraments and services has remained the same for over thirty years throughout the Dioceses of Wisconsin. Recently, when the Bishops of the State of Wisconsin gathered, they decreed that stipends should be adjusted to reflect the current time.

> The new stipend structure is as follows: Mass Stipend \$20 Sanctuary Candle \$20 Funeral Stole fee \$75 Wedding & Quinceanera Stole fee \$100

This new fee structure will become effective July 1, 2024. It will <u>not</u> be applied retroactively to those who have already paid the appropriate amount from the former fee scale. The new fee structure will be applied to all new requests received as of July 1, 2024. As always, if someone is not able to offer the stipend, the parish is happy to provide the sacrament or service with no fee. Please know, too, that any stipend money collected goes to the parish in support of its ministry and services provided to the parish community; it does not go personally to the priest.


### St. Gregory Spring Fling & Golf Outing Friday, June 14 Autumn Ridge Golf Course

### Masses for the Families of the Parish (Reprint of Notice to Answer Your Questions)

Have you noticed a Mass being offered for your family, but you don't know who scheduled it? Masses can be offered for the benefit of any person living or dead, or for any intention, as long as it is not contrary to the teachings of the Church. Sunday Masses are by far the most popular dates that people request for Mass intention. Since the law only allows one stipend per Mass\*, Mass intentions for Sundays usually fill up fairly quickly. However, Mass intentions for weekday Masses often remain open. The practice in both parishes is that when there is an open Mass intention, the families of the parishes are scheduled for the intention. In this way, the parish administrator can offer Mass for the spiritual benefit of every family in the parish. Since these intentions are scheduled by the parish office, you are not required to pay the customary Mass stipend, nor are you required to attend the Mass.






