Thoughts for Today's Readings


To the Point: When Jesus ascends into heaven, he completes the work of the resurrection. His conquest of death opens the gates of heaven and restores hu-

manity's ability to be fully with God. Now Jesus enters into the fulness of that presence, the first human person to be so united with God. He waits for us to follow him there. And in the meantime, he leaves his disciples with a mission. They are to preach and to heal—that is, they are to continue the work that Christ did in his years of public ministry. They are to make him present and visible and accessible when the ascension makes him less so. But he does not leave them alone in this work—the last line of this gospel has him as the subject, working with the disciples and confirming their preaching by working signs through them.

To Experience: Those of us who live in a post-ascension world can feel envious of the disciples who got to share this life and this world with Jesus. We might long to hear his voice and encounter his presence as they did. We rely on their witness and their testimony for our own faith. But Jesus is no less present to us; he comes in word and sacrament to be close to us always.

- Imagine yourself with the disciples at the ascension. What emotions does it evoke in you to see Jesus raised to heaven?
- We do not experience Jesus in body like the disciples did, but Jesus remains present with us. How do you most powerfully experience Jesus' ongoing presence on earth?
- How do you participate in the mission that Jesus left to the church? How do you preach the gospel and bring Jesus' healing to others?

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

One of the motivations to pray the Rosary is that throughout its 800 year history the Rosary has been associated with signs and wonders. Most famously, was the miraculous victory of the Catholic forces over the Muslims forces at the battle of Lepanto in 1571. In 1858 at Lourdes, France, the Blessed Virgin Mary encouraged St. Bernadette to pray the Rosary, and later revealed to her the location to dig and unleashed a miraculous spring of water that has been associated with countless healing miracles ever since. In 1917, over 70,000 people witnessed the miracle of Fatima when the sun danced in the sky. The Blessed Virgin Mary promised this sign to the three shepherd children as a proof that she really appeared to them and exhorted them to pray the Rosary for peace.

There are many other miracles, signs and wonders associated with the Rosary. These three examples serve to remind us that the Rosary promises victory in the battle, healing in times of hurt, and strengthening of faith in times of doubt.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes many aspects of the Christian life as a battle. "There is no holiness without renunciation and spiritual battle (paragraph 2015). "Prayer is a battle. Against whom? Against ourselves and against the wiles of the tempter who does all he can to turn man away from prayer, away from union with God. We pray as we live, because we live as we pray. If we do not want to act habitually according to the Spirit of Christ, neither can we pray habitually in his name. The 'spiritual battle' of the Christian's new life is inseparable from the 'battle of prayer'" (paragraph 2725). The Christian way of life is not an easy road, since it is following Christ as He carried the Cross. If Mary gave victory to the Catholic forces at Lepanto through the praying of the Rosary, can we not expect the Rosary to lead us to victory in the battles of Christian life?

Every person is in need of healing. Some are in need of physical healing. All of us carry some emotional and spiritual wounds. Unforgiveness is an epidemic striking at the heart of many families. Regret due to past sins is a heavy burden that most people carry. Many people who have bathed in the waters at Lourdes and prayed the Rosary have experienced miraculous healing. Can we not expect that Mary will bring healing to us, her spiritual children, when we have a devotion to the Rosary?

Lastly, for many reasons it seems like it is more difficult to believe in contemporary culture. We seem to live in an age of doubt. In the face of great doubts, Mary revealed a sign at Fatima to confirm the three children in their faith, along with the 70,000 witnesses who had gathered that day. Can we not expect that the regular and devoted recitation of the Rosary cannot help to strengthen our own faith?

As Catholics all over the world commemorate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles on the Feast of Pentecost on May 18-19, the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, led by its four teams of Perpetual Pilgrims, will kick off with landmark events at the

launch point of each route:

The Serra Route will begin on May 19 with 11 am Mass at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption in San Francisco, CA. A Eucharistic procession led by Archbishop Cordileone will follow across the Golden Gate Bridge and end in the evening at St. Mary Star of the Sea in Sausalito.

The Marian Route kickoff Mass on May 19 will be presided over by Bishop Andrew Cozzens, Chair of the National Eucharistic Revival. It will take place outdoors at Lake Itasca Park in his home diocese of Crookston, MN along with six bishops from neighboring dioces-

The Seton Route launches on May 18 with Pentecost Viail at the tomb of Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney in New Haven, CT. It will consist of an extended and grand liturgy with overnight



Eucharistic adoration to follow.

The Juan Diego Route will begin in the Diocese of Brownsville, TX, on May 19 with stops at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception and the Basilica of the National Shrine of Our Lady of San Juan del Valle, a shrine which receives more than one million pilgrims each year.

"A cross-country pilgrimage of this scale has never been attempted before. All told, it will travel through 27 states and 65 dioceses, covering a combined distance of 6,500 miles on foot and with the help of support vehicles," said Tim Glemkowski, CEO of the National Eucharistic Congress, Inc. "It will be a tremendously powerful action of witness and intercession as it interacts with local parish communities at stops all along the way. Following Jesus and praying through cities and rural towns is going to be life changing for the Church across America; I personally cannot wait to participate in this pilgrimage!"
