Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Storms can be a source of awe. Their thundering might can evoke in us an appreciation for the God who created the natural world. But we are

only able to have this reaction when we are safe from them. The disciples are not observing this storm from a cozy cabin window; they are in its midst and at its mercy. So their awe comes not from this power of the natural world but from the peace to which it gives way in response to Jesus' power. They are filled with awe at the control he displays, at the commands the sea obeys, and at the peace he brings. Much of our appreciation for God comes from what God does for us—stilling storms or providing us shelter, watering the earth and allowing it to dry in due season.

To Experience: Jesus takes control of the storm in this gospel, but we know that God does not always interfere in the natural rhythms of the world, even when they are destructive. In a world with increasingly extreme weather patterns, it is important to remember that God calls us to partnership in caring for creation. God cares for the natural world with and through us, and we can and should take action to preserve God's great gift of creation.

- 1. What in the natural world evokes awe in you? Where do you find God present in creation?
- 2. How do you cling to God in the storms of life? What storms has God accompanied you safely through?
- 3. How can you take action to care for creation in order to preserve the great gifts of God present there?

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This is my second to last column for you. When I arrived, I was told to expect to be with you for five years. If I would have known that my time was go-

ing to be cut short, I would have taken a different approach to my mission here. I would have still loved you all the same, but it is not right to leave projects open ended.

Shortly after my arrival, both parishes relaunched the One-by-One campaign. Both parishes made their goal. Both parishes have good projects that the money raised will support.

Will these projects be completed? I do not know, but you are owed a status update.

The main project for Holy Trinity was to reconfigure the offices so that parishioners can be better welcomed for funeral and wedding planning, for pastoral counseling and meeting with the priest, to provide a better working environment for our administrative assistant, and to have a place to store records rather than the parish garage. The septic system was a higher priority, and once that is completed, a committee will be formed to develop some proposals.

The main project for St. Gregory was to make a final decision about the status of the rectory building. The buildings and grounds committee has hired a home inspector to get a better idea of the scope of required work, and pending the outcome of that inspection, a decision will be made. Both remodeling or demolition are significant expenses. The decision will be determined by the scope of the work that is required. If maintaining the rectory is a financially viable project, it would provide a pastor a choice about where to live.

I will be honest, the current rectory at Holy Trinity feels like I am living in a fishbowl. I have shared with the financial and pastoral councils of both parishes that there has to be a long term plan developed for providing a living space for the pastor that truly provides him a home with adequate privacy.

UPDATED STIPEND & STOLE FEE STRUCTURE Effective July 1, 2024

New stipend structure is as follows: Mass Stipend \$20 Sanctuary Candle \$20 Funeral Stole fee \$75 Wedding & Quinceanera Stole fee \$100

This new fee structure will <u>not</u> be applied retroactively to those who have already paid the appropriate amount from the former fee scale. The new fee structure will be applied to all new requests received as of July 1, 2024. As always, if someone is not able to offer the stipend, the parish is happy to provide the sacrament or service with no fee. Please know, too, that any stipend money collected goes to the parish in support of its ministry and services provided to the parish community; it does not go personally to the priest.
