

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: The stories of healing in this gospel reveal that Jesus sees and loves each of us as individuals. It seems contradictory, that Jesus can love all of

us with such wholehearted devotion. But his love is not diminished or fractured by the fact that there are so many of us to love. Here, surrounded as he is by a crowd, he notices and extends kindness to the suffering ones around him. The woman with hemorrhages would have gone unnoticed by anyone else, but Jesus takes note of her and restores her dignity as well as her health. And there is utter tenderness in Jesus' approach to Jairus's daughter. He takes her hand, he calls her "little girl." He loves her back to life. Mark tells us of this girl and this woman, but Jesus looks at every member of the crowd—and at every one of us—with the same healing and lifegiving love.

To Experience: The clinical word "hemorrhage" can blur the suffering of the woman who reached out to Jesus for healing. She was likely suffering from irregular menstrual cycles, the unpredictability of which meant she was unable to obtain the ritual cleanliness necessary for participation in temple worship. Female health issues are still often considered taboo, and their personal nature can make them hard to talk about. Those who suffer from them often feel alone, especially when they might affect fertility. But Jesus is with them; he sees their secret suffering and does not shy away. He invites all women—single or married, childless or mothers of many, hyperfertile or infertile—to reach out to him for healing.

- 1. How have you experienced Jesus' healing in your life? What in your life do you still wish Jesus would heal?
- 2. How do you show your faith in Jesus? How do you ask him to heal your suffering?
- 3. How do you participate in the healing and life-giving work of God? How can you better partner with God in transforming the world's suffering?

My heart is filled with gratitude that God has given me the time here that He has. Your welcome and hospitality, support and prayers, have all been much more than I deserve. Thank you.

Looking to the future, have confidence. God will continue to do amazing things here. In cooperation with the grace that God has given to these communities, I do ask for the following: be generous with your service to the parishes. Numerous parishioners have taken real ownership in outreach, evangelization, and faith enrichment. Continue to do the good work that God has inspired you to do. Some of this work may seem like a spark, but the Holy Spirit can fan it into a blazing fire, if you keep at it.

Let the promotion of priestly vocations be a central focus of these parishes. Unfortunately, in the church, we do not always talk as directly as we should. So let's be direct, the main reason that parishes in the diocese of Green Bay do not have the stability of longterm pastors is the continued shortage of priests. Pray for more vocations to the priesthood. Encourage your sons, grandsons, and nephews to be priests. I am convinced that there are four priestly vocations among the young men and boys at St. Gregory Parish, and two priestly vocations among the young men and boys at Holy Trinity Parish. It will be a joy for me to return to these parishes multiple times to share in the celebration of the first Mass of the priest sons from these parishes.

God has done great things here and will continue to do great things, if we continue strong in faith and confident in hope.
