### Thoughts for Today's Readings



**To the Point:** The whirlwind pace of Mark's Gospel includes lots of admiring crowds pressing around Jesus; it often seems he cannot get away from those who want to be near him and have access to his healing and preaching. In this gospel, though, he is met with skepticism. He returns to his hometown—a place where many of us hope to be embraced and have our accomplishments celebrated. But those who knew him as a child cannot accept who he has grown into. Their presuppositions prevent them from encountering what others have found in him. We, too, can make assumptions about what we think we know. It is all too easy to miss God's work, which often breaks into the mundane in surprising ways.

**To Experience:** Our baptisms unite us to Christ as priest, prophet, and king. It is sometimes odd to claim these titles for ourselves; they seem like they should be reserved for just a few special chosen ones. But each of us *is* chosen, unique and unrepeatable and called by God to put our unique set of gifts into the service of others. We are called to sanctify the world and to share God's word.

1. When do you make assumptions about people that might keep you from encountering Christ in others?
2. When have you been surprised by the presence or action of God? How can you stay open to God's appearances in unexpected places?
3. What do you understand a prophet to be? How do you participate in Jesus' office of prophet?

On July 17th, St. Gregory Parish participated in the historic journey of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage as part of the Marian Route (North) originating in Mississippi Headwaters, Lake Itasca, MN. We were blessed and honored with accompanying Jesus as he journeys to Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Revival being held July 17–21. Catholics will come together from the four corners of the nation and then converge ... gathered as one Church ... we will present our wounded and imperfect hearts to the triune God who loves us. Just as he did on the road to Emmaus, our Lord will listen to our worries and reveal himself once more in the breaking of the bread.

We are rooted in the Eucharist. The National Eucharistic Congress is not the end of the journey but the launching point for the mission. We will capture the spirit and momentum of the Revival and learn how to live as missionaries going forward flowing from the Eucharist as the source and summit of our faith.

**Two of our parishioners, Jean Blattner and Danielle Faust, have been chosen by the Diocese to participate** in our diocesan delegation to the Congress, a group of 250 people. Each day, they will have the opportunity to participate in Mass, Reconciliation, Adoration, and will be part of a procession through the streets of Indianapolis. They will attend sessions (along with all the diocesan delegates) on how to enliven the faith in our local communities, as well as sessions of their own choosing to help build them on their spiritual journey and learn about important topics. Everyone from the Congress will attend a revival session each day focused on a different theme.

Some of the event content will be available for viewing online. Speakers at the congress include prominent Catholic names such as Fr. Mike Schmitz, Bishop Robert Baron, Dr. Edward Sri, and Julianne Stanz. To learn more about the congress, visit [www.eucharisticcongress.org](http://www.eucharisticcongress.org).

The cost of the trip for all diocesan representatives has been covered by a very generous donation to the diocese, and any remaining costs are being paid for by the pilgrims themselves. A prayer for travelers will be offered for our pilgrims at Mass on July 14th at the 8 and 10am Masses.

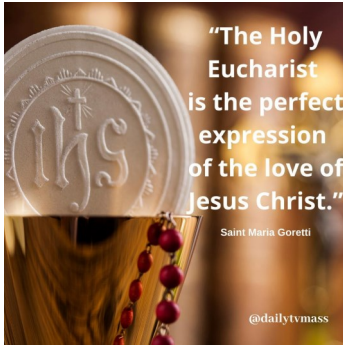

**Saint Maria Goretti**

**Feast Day:**  
July 6

**Patron Saint of:**  
Catholic Youth  
Girls

One of the largest crowds ever assembled for a canonization—250,000—symbolized the reaction of millions touched by the simple story of Maria Goretti. She was the daughter of a poor Italian tenant farmer, had no chance to go to school, never learned to read or write. When Maria made her First Communion not long before her death, she was one of the larger and somewhat backward members of the class.

On a hot afternoon in July, Maria was sitting at the top of the stairs of her house, mending a shirt. She was not quite 12 years old, but physically mature. A cart stopped outside, and a neighbor, 18-year-old Alessandro, ran up the stairs. He seized her and pulled her into a bedroom. She struggled and tried to call for help. "No, God does not wish it," she cried out. "It is a sin. You would go to hell for it." Alessandro began striking at her blindly with a long dagger.

Maria was taken to a hospital. Her last hours were marked by the usual simple compassion of the good—concern about where her mother would sleep, forgiveness of her murderer (she had been in fear of him, but did not say anything lest she cause trouble to his family), and her devout welcoming of Viaticum, her last Holy Communion. She died about 24 hours after the attack.

Alessandro was sentenced to 30 years in prison. For a long time he was unrepentant and surly. One night he had a dream or vision of Maria gathering flowers and offering them to him. His life changed. When he was released after 27 years, his first act was to beg the forgiveness of Maria's mother.

Devotion to the young martyr grew, miracles were worked, and in less than half a century she was canonized. At her beatification in 1947, her 82-year-old mother, two sisters, and her brother appeared with Pope Pius XII on the balcony of St. Peter's. Three years later, at Maria's canonization, a 66-year-old Alessandro Serenelli knelt among the quarter-million people and cried tears of joy.

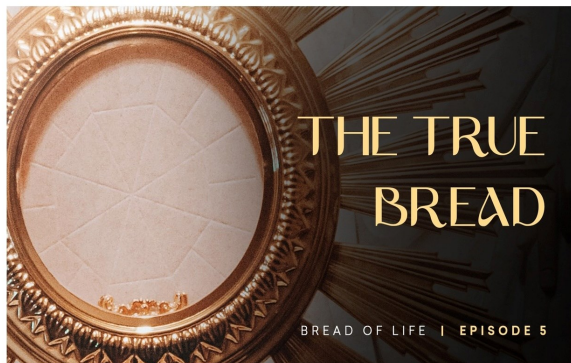
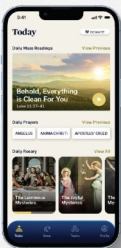

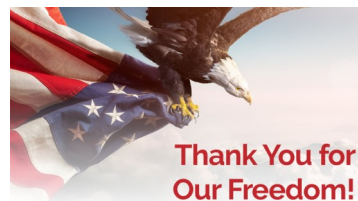
