

Holy Day of Obligation: Immaculate Conception (Mon., Dec. 9)

This year the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary on December 8 falls on the Second Sunday of Advent, therefore, the observation of this feast day has been moved to December 9. In accordance with Canon 1246, the feast "must be observed as a day of obligation on the day to which it is transferred." Thus, Monday, December 9 is a day of obligatory Mass attendance.

Parish Offices will be Closed: Monday, December 9.

December Green Sunday Collection will take place December 14 & 15 (next weekend), ahead of the Christmas Masses.

Christian Women: Calendars are still available if you could use some for over the holiday when gathering with family and friends. You have until December 31, 2024 to return them.

This weekend, our parishes will take a Retirement Collection. This will be to benefit two groups of people who have served us faithfully. Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: The first paragraph of this gospel might seem superfluous—all those names and places are nearly meaningless to us in our time and place. But

they serve a purpose: they are locating John the Baptist (and soon Jesus) in a specific time and place. Jesus' humanity is not half-baked. He enters into human history with all its political turmoil. He is born in a real place with real leaders and their ongoing, feeble attempts at peace. He lives amid all these goings-on as we do, and yet he will transcend them. Even as we wait for his final coming, he already is the true King whose power is in weakness and who leads by humble service. It is in Jesus that we will find at last the peace for which humanity has always yearned.

To Experience: The baptism John proclaims is all about repentance. Its participants turn from sin and turn back toward right relationship with God. Our baptisms today still have this cleansing character, but they are also much more than that. John's baptism anticipates the fullness of what Jesus will offer, because when Jesus participates in John's baptism, he elevates it. It is still about the washing away of sin, but it is also a moment of adoption, when God enfolds us into God's family and names us as God's beloved children.

- 1. What "mountains" are keeping you from God right now? What do you need leveled in order to run more freely to God?
- What does your baptism mean to you in this season of life? If you don't know the date, try to find our and add it to your calendar for the coming year. How could you remember or honor that date in a special way?

Rorate Caeli Masses in Honor of Our Lady Saturday, December 14 7am at St. Gregory

The Rorate Caeli Mass is a traditional Advent devotion wherein the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn. In many instances families and individuals travel an hour or more, rising and arriving very early for this stunningly beautiful Mass. The interplay of light and darkness speak to the meaning of Advent and the coming of the Light of the world.

The Mass takes its title, Rorate Caeli, from the first words of the Introit, which are from Isaiah 45:8:

"Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes pluant justum, aperiatur terra, et germinet Salvatorem."
"Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Saviour."

The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. Because it is a votive Mass in Mary's honor, white vestments are worn instead of Advent violet. In the dimly lit setting, priests and faithful prepare to honor the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ.

The readings and prayers of the Mass foretell the prophecy of the Virgin who would bear a Son called Emmanuel, and call on all to raise the gates of their hearts and their societies to let Christ the King enter; asking for the grace to receive eternal life by the merits of the Incarnation and saving Resurrection of Our Lord.


