Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: In the gospel, it appears that Jesus is taking sides, but the reality is that he offers the same forgiveness to the scribes and Pharisees that he offers to the woman. The ones who are stingy in love and forgiveness, the ones who try to limit the merciful capacity of God, are the ones who are unable to face the love that God offers. The scribes and Pharisees choose their own side. They decide for themselves that they are unable to accept the love that he offers. They insist that they are different from this woman, when they are also sinners in need of God's mercy.

To Experience: As in Jesus' day, there can be a temptation to see sexual sins as worse than all others. Purity culture has convinced many people that our personal value lies in our sexual morality and that our chastity is the most important measure of our spiritual lives. But our value lies in the infinite dignity that God freely gives to us, and our spiritual lives are defined by our participation in God's life. Sex is tricky because it is powerful and can easily distract us from pursuit of God, but it's not the only thing that can make or break our relationship with God.

1. How have you experienced Jesus' forgiveness? How could you extend that forgiveness to others?
2. How could you grow in awareness of your own dependence on God? How might your life change if you truly understood that you are not in control?
3. What great things has God done for you? How does your life reflect gratitude for these wonders?

Dear Friends in Christ,

In the Gospel passage John 8:1-11, we witness a profound narrative that encapsulates Jesus' boundless mercy and his call for personal transformation. The scene unfolds with a woman caught in sin, brought before Jesus by the Scribes and the Pharisees. After her accusers, convicted by their own consciences, depart, Jesus addresses the woman directly, "Neither do I condemn you; Go, and from now on sin no more."

This account serves as a compelling lesson on the importance of compassion and introspection in our daily interactions. The accusers were eager to enforce the law, highlighting the woman's sin while overlooking their own. Jesus' response redirects this judgmental fervor back onto the accusers, prompting them to recognize their own imperfections.

This teaches us that before we pass judgment on others, we must first examine our own lives and acknowledge our shortcomings. By fostering self-awareness, we can approach others with empathy and understanding, creating a more supportive and forgiving community. This approach aligns with the teachings of Christ and healthier relationships.

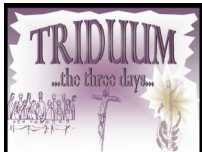
Spiritually, this passage reveals the depth and the transformative potential of divine mercy. Despite the woman's undeniable guilt, Jesus chooses not to condemn her. Instead, he offers her an opportunity for renewal, instructing her to "Go, and from now on sin no more." He offers a new path forward, free from sin.

This act underscores the principle that God's grace is available to all, regardless of past transgressions. It invites us to accept this mercy wholeheartedly, to turn away from sinful behaviors, and to embark on a path of spiritual growth and holiness. This narrative reassures us that no matter our past, we are not beyond the reach of God's forgiveness and the possibility of a new beginning.

In embracing both the practical lesson of compassionate self-reflection and the spiritual understanding of transformative mercy, we align ourselves more closely with the teaching of Christ. This alignment encourages us to build a more loving and forgiving world, reflecting the boundless grace that has been extended to us.

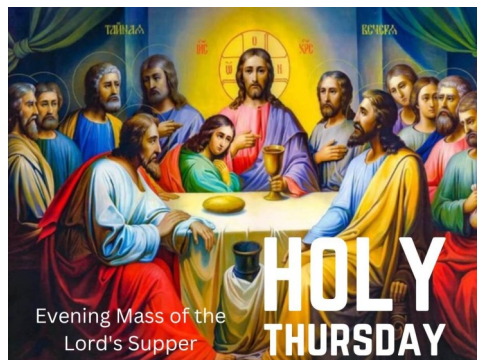

many blessings from the Holy Family.

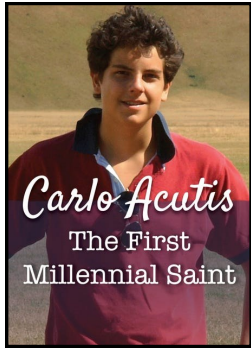
The 21 mile walk spiritually prepares us for our destination – America's only Church-approved

Bl. Carlo is the **first millennial saint to be canonized**, and his story powerfully witnesses *extraordinary holiness in an ordinary life*. He rose early to attend daily Mass before school, proclaiming the Eucharist as his “highway to Heaven.” He inspired his mother to return to Church. He used technology to catalog Eucharistic miracles and spread the Gospel with as many people as possible.

Who is Carol Acutis?

- **Birth and Early Life:** Carlo Acutis was born to Italian parents in London, UK, on May 3, 1991, and grew up in Milan, Italy.
- **Early Devotion:** Carlo’s parents were not active in their faith, but following his First Communion, Carlo developed an intense devotion to Christ, leading to a conversion and deep devotion to God in his parents and many others he encountered.
- **Acts of Charity:** Carlo’s life was marked by extraordinary acts of charity. He was known for his kindness, helping the homeless, and volunteering at soup kitchens.
- **Mystical Life:** From a young age, Carlo exhibited a deep mystical life, often spending hours in prayer and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.
- **Eucharistic Miracles:** Carlo had a profound love for the Eucharist, which manifested in his fascination with Eucharistic Miracles. He dedicated himself to cataloging these miracles online to help others deepen their faith.
- **Technology for Evangelization:** Carlo was computer savvy and used his skills to create a website documenting Eucharistic Miracles, showing how technology can be used for evangelization.
- **Battle with Leukemia:** Carlo was diagnosed with leukemia at the age of 15. Despite his illness, he offered his suffering for the Pope and the Church, showing remarkable faith and serenity.
- **Death:** Carlo Acutis died in Monza, Italy, on October 12, 2006, at the age of 15. His life and faith left a lasting impact on all who knew him.
- **Beatification:** Carlo was beatified on October 12, 2020, in Assisi, Italy. Many who had been inspired by his life and work attended his beatification.
- **Canonization Announcement:** On May 23, 2024, the Vatican announced that Pope Francis had recognized the second miracle necessary for Carlo to be named the Church’s first millennial saint, paving the way for his canonization.

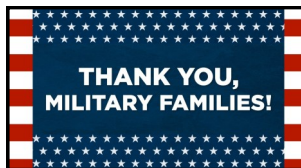
