Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: In this gospel, the hints of resurrection we saw last week finally culminate in Jesus' appearance. Jesus himself, the one they saw crucified and buried, returns to his followers and stands in their

midst. His body is still his own human body, still bearing the scars of his passion. It is really he, the one they loved and followed, the one who changed their lives. But he is going to change their lives again. His return will not be for long, and they will not all go back to the way things were. They have a job to do now, and Jesus immediately starts preparing his disciples for mission, to be sent out on his behalf. He breathes the Holy Spirit on them so that they will not go forth alone. His physical presence will not remain, but he will go with them always, his life transcending the usual boundaries of time and space to which we are still bound.

To Experience: Thomas's doubts are admirable in a way. We see here someone who does not blindly accept what others say but who holds out for real encounter with the living God. And when he does see that God, he allows the encounter to change him. We do not get to experience Jesus as clearly as Thomas did; we rely on the witness of others to know of the resurrection. But if we train our eyes to see God more subtly present, then when we do encounter Jesus in all the many ways he remains with us, we can cry with Thomas, "My Lord and my God!"

- 1. What makes it hard for you to believe in the risen Jesus or in his presence still among us? How do you hope God will address those doubts?
- When Jesus appears to the disciples, the first word he speaks to them is *peace*. Where in your life do you need the peace that Jesus promises?
- 3. Is there anything holding you back from participating fully in the church's joy this Easter? How could your community support you in your grief or pain?

Peace Be With You!

Dear Friends in the Risen Lord,

On the Second Sunday of Easter, the Church contemplates the merciful heart of the Risen Christ. The Gospel draws us into that powerful evening encounter between Jesus and His disciples. It is the first day of the week. Though the doors were locked in fear, Jesus comes in peace. He shows them His wounds - not as a reminder of shame, but as signs of victory, love, and healing.

One disciple was missing: Thomas. When told of the Lord's appearance, he declared, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in His hands and put my finger into the nail marks and my hand into His side, I will not believe." A week later, Jesus appears again and speaks directly to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see My hands.... do not be unbelieving, but believe"

Did Thomas touch Jesus?

"No" is the answer. Instead, Thomas cries out in faith, "My Lord and my God!" It was not the touch, but the encounter with Christ's mercy that moved his heart. Jesus, far from rejecting his doubt, invites him into deeper faith. Then He blesses all who would come after, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Divine Mercy Sunday reminds us that God meets us where we are - in fear, doubt, or sin - and offers peace. His mercy is not earned, but **given freely**. His wounds remain visible, not to condemn us, but to assure us: we are loved, we are forgiven, we are sent.

"Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them..." With these words, Jesus entrusted His mercy to the Church. In every confession, in every Eucharist, the Risen Lord breathes new life into us.

Let us echo Thomas' humble and bold prayer, "My Lord and my God!"





Divine Mercy Sunday—Did You Know?

What is the Divine Mercy image?

The Divine Mercy image is a depiction of Jesus based on a vision that St. Faustina had in 1931. There have been a number of paintings made of this image. A basic explanation of the image is:

Jesus is shown in most versions as raising his right hand in blessing, and pointing with his left hand on his chest from which flow forth two rays: one red and one white (translucent). The depictions often contains the message "Jesus, I trust in You!" The rays streaming out have symbolic meaning: red for the blood of Jesus (which is the Life of Souls), and pale for the water (which justify souls) (from Diary - 299). The whole image is symbolic of charity, forgiveness and love of God, referred to as the "Fountain of Mercy".

What is the Chaplet of Divine Mercy?

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is a set of prayers used as part of the Divine Mercy devotion. They are usually said using a standard set of Rosary beads, often at 3 p.m. (the time of Jesus' death), but with a different set of prayers than those used in the Marian Rosary.

How does this relate to the Sacrament of Confession?

It relates directly to it. Jesus empowered the apostles (and their successors in ministry) with the Holy Spirit to *either* forgive *or* retain (not forgive) sins. Because they are empowered with God's Spirit to do this, their administration of forgiveness is effective; it really removes sin rather than just being a symbol of forgiveness a person is already thought to have obtained. Because they are instructed to forgive *or retain*, they must discern which they are to do. This means that they need to know about the sin and whether we are truly repentant of it. As a result, we must tell them about the sin and our sorrow for it. Hence: confession.

Think of your confession before Easter Sunday/Divine Mercy Sunday as the big annual "spring cleaning" time for your soul. And then, when your inner house is all cleaned up, you will be ready to receive the Lord Himself in Holy Communion and enthrone Him in the center of your heart as your King!

May Processions

The Village of St. Nazianz has a beautiful tradition, started by Fr. Oschwald. Three times a year Fr. Oschwald led a procession. In this way, they, and we, can express our faith, honor our Blessed Mother, and ask God to bless the community—those living and those who have died.

Praying the Rosary and Stations of the Cross is powerful. We should remember our families, private intentions, and Church in our prayers.

Our pilgrimage on May 3, begins at the Community Center, near the Guardian Angel statue (see map). There we will remember Fr. Oschwald, and also Rachel and Joe, two young people who were strong in their faith.

We will then pray the Rosary, focusing on the Joyful Mysteries, as we walk to the statue of Mary located on South 2nd Avenue. We will continue the Rosary as we walk to the site of the altar of the old church on West Birch Street.

Our fourth stop will be Holy Resurrection Monastery. At this time we will pray the Stations of the Cross, pausing at each station.

We will then proceed to St. Gregory Church as we say a second Rosary, this time focusing on the Glorious Mysteries. We will cross Church Street, then walk on the sidewalk, and steps to reach the Prayer Garden. Going through the garden, we will then reach the main church doors and enter the church.



We are asking everyone to participate in the Pilgrimage, asking God to shower His blessings on us and renew our faith in this Year of Hope. Let us bring our prayers to God through our Blessed Mother as we walk. Hope to see you there.


Sunday, May 4 Holy Trinity Parish
