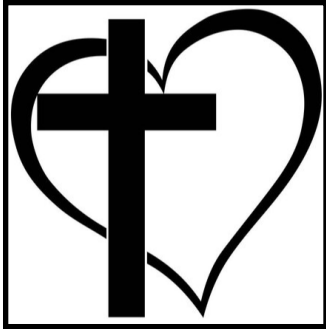

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: There is a tragic resignation in Simon Peter's announcement that he is going fishing. Fishing is what he did before Jesus, and we saw him leave it behind way back on the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. When Jesus provided a miraculously extravagant catch of fish, Simon Peter left his boats, his nets, even the very catch Jesus had just provided. He dropped it all to follow Christ. Now, in the wake of Jesus' death, when their years together seemed to be for nothing, he picks up where he left off, ready to act as if Jesus had not radically changed his life. But Jesus calls again, and Peter recognizes him in a miraculous catch of fish reminiscent of their first meeting. He leaps back to Jesus, ready now for a permanently changed life.

To Experience: Like Peter, we often experience ups and downs in our journey with Christ. Our human emotions are fickle, and we might feel enthusiastic one day but indifferent the next. The challenge is to maintain commitment through these ups and downs, maintaining disciplines of prayer and sacrifice that help us grow into a mature, enduring faith.

1. Like Peter, our journeys with Christ are bound to have ups and downs. Where do you feel you are in your journey? What would help you to grow into a mature faith willing to endure suffering for Christ?
2. Jesus does not promise that emotional fulfillment will always come from following him. What disciplines help you to maintain a commitment to Jesus even when emotion is lacking?
3. How do you respond when your faith is challenged or questioned? How could you grow in courage to share Jesus' story lovingly with those who may need to hear it?

Hear to Serve

Feed My Sheep

All eyes are watching Rome with the conclave to elect a new pope beginning in a few days. Who will be the one to be the new Shepherd of the Church? Who will be the one called to, "Feed my sheep"? This new pope will make an even deeper commitment of love to Jesus. He will dedicate the rest of his life to the service of Christ's Church. This new pope will be led where he may not really have wanted to go, but because he loves Jesus, he will go.

Our participation in the process is to pray and wait. Or is it? Did Jesus mean those words just for Peter? Is it just the pope who is called to, "Tend my sheep?" I was at a parish meeting in Manitowoc about sixteen years ago where the priest told us that if we were not participating in some type of ministry, we should be. He also said that if we had been doing the same ministry for several years, it may be time to change. We were instructed to pray about it and see where Jesus was leading us. This is the time that I first felt the call to the Diaconate. Believe me, this was not where I wanted to be led. Me, be a deacon? No, I had other plans. Well, it may be that I had other plans, but this is the plan Jesus had for me.

What is the plan Jesus has for you? Think about how you are sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It is a good idea to read the readings before Mass each Sunday and ask God to speak to your heart. Share the Gospel with your family in relatable ways. Show your children how Jesus would approach issues of daily life. Be ready to talk about your faith with others and to defend the truth. You can also literally share the Word of God by becoming a lector.

Be a good example of a Catholic Christian to others. Demonstrate the love of Christ to those who are in your care by protecting their health and safety. Support those in our parish who are struggling or hurting. Reach out to everyone who needs food, clothing, shelter, or a visit. The Knights of Columbus, Caring Hearts and Hands, the Food Pantry, and Christian Women are groups that put the love of Christ into action.

Grow in faith and encourage others in their faith journey. Get to really know Jesus through daily prayer and Adoration. Pray for strong vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, religious life, and marriage. Join the Bible Study or the Women's Group. Participate in prayer gatherings like our processions. Attend the Adult Formation gatherings and the Day of Prayer and Retreat. Parents help your children learn and live the Gospel. Bring your children to Mass every week and encourage them to become altar servers. Parishioners can help our children grow in faith by becoming catechists in our RE program.

There are so many other ways to serve the Lord in our parishes and community. Join the choir, be on the councils, help to clean and repair the buildings and grounds, mentor a couple preparing for marriage, or greet at Mass. Show extraordinary hospitality at church and at home. The message of the Gospel today is clear. Jesus wants us to love Him by taking care of His sheep. We must be willing to give up all self-centeredness and be led where He wants us to go.

Overview of Finance Council Responsibilities:

- Oversees the accounting system for the parish and the keeping of financial records
- Oversees the creation of an annual budget in accord with the mission, goals, priorities and plans
- Provides an analysis of income and expenditures in comparison to budget projections
- Assures that a complete and understandable annual financial report is made to parishioners
- Ensures that financial procedures for internal controls are in place for the oversight of cash and financial accounts
- Makes recommendations for the generation of revenue in support of the overall mission of the parish
- Oversees and coordinates all fundraising within the parish in accord with Church Canon Law & the Diocesan proxy process
- Monitors investments
- Oversees the day-to-day and long-range maintenance of parish buildings and grounds
- Monitors the observance of diocesan personnel policies pertaining to labor and the conduct of business in employment and compensation of workers

Overview of Parish Council Responsibilities:

- Works in collaboration with the pastor and staff to discern and carry out the will of God for our parish now and into the future
- Works with the pastor, staff, committees, and parish organizations for the common good and mission of the parish
- Assists in the development of parish policies and strategies to address concerns and needs
- Collaborates with pastor to assess needs, establish goals and priorities and review the overall operation of the parish for the previous year

Membership Terms (for both Councils):

- Member at Large—Serve for a three year term, renewable once
- Secretary & Treasurer Trustee—Serve for a two year term, renewable twice (elected position)
 - Treasurer Trustee—a member of the finance council
 - Secretary Trustee—a member of the parish council

Treasurer Trustee

- Serves as member of Finance Council
- Assists with review and adherence to Parish Financial Instructions
- Assists with overseeing the coordination and maintenance of accurate and detailed accounts of all receipts and disbursements of parish funds
- Assists in the collection of parish contributions and special collections
- Assists in management of parish investments
- Assures timely preparation and distribution of financial reports to the parish and the diocese
- Assures that records of all parish property, property tax documents and parish inventory are maintained

Secretary Trustee

- Serves as member of Pastoral Council
- Assists with ensuring the pastoral care of the parish
- Ensures the parish annual meeting is held
- Assists in taking and keeping minutes of all meetings of the corporate board of directors
- Attends to corporate notices and correspondence
- Assists to ensure that proxy documents are recorded and filed.
- Ensures that all corporate reports as prescribed by federal, state, local, and diocesan authorities are prepared and filed
- Assists in development of parish policies and strategies to address the needs and mission of the church

How is a New Pope Elected?

The election of a Pope, also known as the conclave, involves a secret ballot process where cardinals vote to choose a new leader for the Catholic Church. The cardinals, in their respective order of rank, take an oath, place their ballot in an urn, and then bow to the altar before returning to their seats. After all ballots are cast, the scrutineers (cardinals who count the votes) tally the votes, and the results are compared.

A More Detailed Look at the Process:

Ballot Voting: Each cardinal receives a ballot and is encouraged to disguise their handwriting to maintain anonymity. The Latin on the ballot translates to: "I choose as Supreme Pontiff".

Scrutineers: The scrutineers, after all votes are cast, count the votes, checking the count against a second set of numbers to ensure accuracy.

Tallying and Tie-breaking: If the vote count matches, a third scrutineer threads a needle through each ballot and ties them together, signifying the end of that round. If no cardinal receives a majority of the votes, the ballots are burned, and a new round of voting begins.

Smoke Signal: A smoke signal is sent from the chimney atop the Sistine Chapel to announce the results to the world. Black smoke indicates an inconclusive vote, while white smoke indicates a new Pope has been elected. The bells of Saint Peter's Basilica also ring when a new Pope is elected.

THE CONCLAVE

A centuries-old system to elect a new pope, all done under the strictest secrecy



ELECTORS

Cardinal aged **under 80** meet 15 to 20 days after the end of pope's reign. They are sworn to secrecy and **remain in isolation** until voting ends.

VOTING

Conclaves are held in the **Sistine Chapel**. There are multiple rounds of voting per day, until one candidate has the **majority**.



SMOKE SIGNALS

Votes are counted then burned. **Black smoke** signals no decision, **White smoke** announces that a **new pope** is elected.



HABEMUS PAPAM

The new pope selects a name and is fitted into his papal robes. He is presented at the balcony of **Saint Peter's Basilica**. The senior cardinal deacon announces: "Habemus Papam". **We have a pope.**

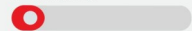
