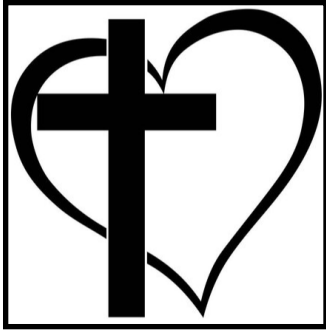

Thoughts for Today's Readings

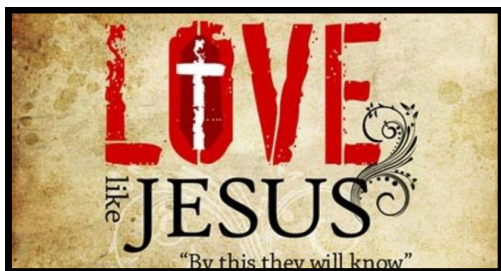


To the Point: As Jesus prepares to leave his disciples, he wants to make sure they hear this message: love for each other is the most important thing. This exhortation is challenging at a time when human disagreements deeply divide the church. Many of us are all too willing to dismiss others as less than Catholic when they fail to share our liturgical preferences or political conclusions. Our witness to the outside world is not clear when we are not showing the love for each other that Jesus very clearly asks of us. The good news, perhaps, is that this is not news—the church has been deeply divided from nearly the beginning, and the Holy Spirit persists in accompanying us despite our seeming inability to live in peace with one another. God is big enough to take us, in all our division, and make us one in a much more real and deeper way than we can understand.

To Experience: The rise of online life has been a gift in many ways—it enables us to find communities that we would have struggled to find before. It also, however, provides a challenge, because we are more able to forsake our real-life communities in favor of something more exclusive and ideal. Before the internet, there was less choice in the matter: God works through online community, too, but consider how you might make an investment in your real-life parish to make it a better community for you and others.

1. In this gospel, Jesus begins to prepare his disciples for his departure. What do you need to hear from Jesus to prepare for times in life when he will be hard to see?
2. Who do you struggle to love? How might Jesus be inviting you to grow in compassion for them?
3. How might you be called to help the church grow in unity?

Hear to Serve

DO THEY KNOW WE ARE CHRISTIANS BY OUR LOVE?

Most of you know that I am not a singer, but when I was reflecting on the Gospel reading for this Sunday a song kept going through my mind. The song is "They'll Know We Are Christians by Our Love." I admit that I did Google the song to read the lyrics. I realized that the lyrics really do help to explain what Jesus meant when he said, "Now the Son of Man is glorified, and God is glorified in Him. God will also glorify Him in Himself and God will glorify Him at once." Secondly Jesus tells us, "As I have loved you, so you should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Love is a word that's ambiguous, it's a strong word, sometimes it's a word we are afraid to use. So, in the world today do people know we are Christians? Do people know we are Disciples of Christ by our love? So often we only think of love as a human emotion, something that is inside of us like that feeling you get when you first meet someone that you're attracted to. But love is more than a feeling; it's a choice. Love is a deliberate action. Love is who we are as Christians. Love is our identity. Do all our actions and choices glorify God? Is the way we live our lives helping others to see God and leading them to heaven?

The song says, "We will walk with each other. We will walk hand in hand, and together we'll spread the news that God is in our land." When we love sharing the Gospel, it can become a passion and bring fullness to our lives. When we do not love what we do, it all becomes a burden. When we do not love others, they too become a burden. When we fail to love others and only love ourselves, even God becomes a burden in our lives. When we love, as Jesus loves, we come to see each other as gifts. We become true companions and helpmates. When we face hardships and persecutions, we have someone who walks with us.

We really are on the journey together. The next verse of the song says, "We will work with each other. We will work side by side, and we'll guard each one's dignity and save each one's pride." Jesus told us this when He gave us the two greatest Commandments: You shall love the Lord, your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind. And You shall love your neighbor as yourself. So let us follow Jesus' example and love like He did. Let us show an interest in others, and take care of others by living out radical mercy and forgiveness. We can protect human dignity by doing Corporal Works of Mercy for the least of our brothers so that no one has to ask or beg.

Let us walk and work together to love as Christ has loved us. When we make our love a choice, an action to help others, that is how we truly glorify the Lord by our lives. It's then the world will know we are Christians by our love.

**Pope Leo XIV's
Papal Coat of Arms**

Pope Leo XIV's Coat of Arms
A Combination of Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary
and Inspiration from St. Augustine

The Pope's coat of arms includes the traditional papal symbols of the crossed keys of St. Peter and episcopal mitre.

The upper left-hand corner of the shield bears a silver fleur-de-lis set against a light blue background. On the bottom right, a red heart topped by a flame and pierced by an arrow sit atop a red book framed by an ivory background.

Pope Leo XIV's motto-IN ILLO UNO UNUM ("In the One, we are one") -sits at the bottom of the coat of arms.

The blue field evokes "the height of the heavens and is distinguished by its Marian significance, with the lily appearing as the classic symbol of the Blessed Virgin Mary."

The opposite corner contains the heart enflamed and pierced by an arrow, which is the emblem of the Order of St. Augustine, of which

Pope Leo XIV served as Prior General for two terms.

This figure symbolically evokes St. Augustine's words in the Confessions: 'Sagittaveras tu cor meum charitate tua' ("You pierced my heart with your love")

From the 16th century on, the symbol has appeared in the Augustinian coat of arms.

It is typically accompanied by the open book, which symbolizes "the Word of God that transforms every human heart, as it did Augustine's."

"The book also recalls the enlightened works that the Doctor of Grace bestowed upon the Church and humanity. White (in the papal arms rendered in ivory) recurs in many religious orders' heraldry as a sign of holiness and purity."
