Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: In the last weeks of the Easter season, we hear Jesus preparing his followers for his ascension, when he will be separated from them for some

time. It is not to be a final separation—even death, after all, could not keep Jesus from them. And he prepares them for Pentecost, too, promising to send his Holy Spirit so that they will not be left alone in his apparent absence. We are still living in a post-ascension world, waiting with the disciples for Jesus' final return. We, too, live in a world where Jesus' presence is in Spirit and sacrament and story rather than in a human body. This can be challenging; it would surely be nice to hear his literal voice and enjoy his bodily presence. Jesus reassures us, though, that he *is* with us, never leaving us alone as we travel through life.

To Experience: Our human brains with their limited capacity are all too quick to draw divisions that are artificial. We see ourselves as separated from Jesus because his human body is no longer among us; he insists that the Spirit and the sacraments make him still truly present among us. We see ourselves as different from our neighbor because of differences in professions or politics; Jesus insists that we are far more alike than not and that the unity he offers transcends these boundaries we draw.

- As the Easter season nears its end, how might you renew your joy in the resurrection?
- 2. What makes it hard for you to trust in the peace Jesus promises? What in this life leaves you troubled or afraid?
- 3. Who inside or outside the church do you struggle to see as beloved brothers and sisters, fellow children of God? How might you express God's love for them?

Hear to Serve



SHOWING REVERENCE FOR OUR LORD RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

The Diocese has sent us the book 33 Days to Eucharistic Glory in hopes that all of us will read it and renew our love for our Lord

in the Eucharist. This makes it a good time to review the guidelines sent from our Diocese on how we receive our Lord at Mass. We have to ask ourselves, "Do I receive with reverence and love, or is it just another motion I go through?"

- First, we need to prepare our bodies by fasting from food or drink for at least an hour before receiving.

 Medical conditions may be an exception.
- Then we ask ourselves if our souls are ready to receive Jesus. We have to be free from grave sin; we need to make the Sacrament of Confession a regular part of our lives. We need to pray daily. During the week we can read Scripture, go to Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, or pray Lectio Divina.
- If we find ourselves not in a state of Grace or are unable to receive for some other reason, we can pray the prayer of Spiritual Communion and invite Jesus into our hearts to strengthen us. (p. 361 Heritage Missal)
- As we come forward in the Communion line, we show our respect by bowing our heads when the person in front of us is receiving.
- It is approved by the Dioceses of the United States of America to receive our Lord in the hand or on the tongue, standing or kneeling. But whichever way we receive we should not make ourselves a source of spiritual elitism in the parish.
- If receiving in the hand, we make a throne for Jesus by taking our weak hand and placing it over our dominant hand. This gives the minister a clear place to put Jesus. When we hear, "The Body of Christ," we respond with AMEN. (Nothing Else). We then take our dominant hand and place Jesus in our mouth.
- We make sure to place Jesus in our mouth before proceeding any further. We do not step to the side and consume Jesus. This is a change from what was taught for the past number of years. It is also important that we allow the minister to place Jesus on our open palm; we receive Jesus, we do not take Him.
- If we receive on the tongue, we slightly tilt our head back, open our mouth, and stick out our tongue. It makes it very hard for the minister to place Jesus when our mouth is only open a crack, and our tongue is not out. (Practice in front of a mirror at home.)
- On days we have the Precious Blood of our Lord; we also bow our head when the person in front of us is receiving, and we also respond, "Amen" when the minister says, "The Blood of Christ." We may kneel to receive the Body of Christ, but we must stand to receive the Blood of Christ.

The Eucharist is the source and summit of all that we believe, for this is truly Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity we are receiving. Making sure we receive Him in a reverent manner gives Him the honor He deserves and will help us to have a more fruitful worship experience.






