Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: As we near the end of the Easter Season, the readings continue to point us with increasing directness toward the eventuality of the ascension. Announcing his impending departure from his earthly life, Jesus promises the apostles at the Last Supper the gift of the Holy Spirit, whom the world "neither sees nor knows." With this almost cryptic language, Jesus tells them that he will continue to be with them in a new way – he will live and they will live. Jesus reassures the apostles that he will not leave them alone but will send the Holy Spirit to be with them. In fact, they will be closer to Jesus than before – Jesus' ascension to the Father brings our own human nature into the trinitarian communion of love that is God. Rather than left as orphans, we are adopted as sons and daughters. The Spirit will breathe God's life into the apostles at Pentecost, and today brings us into communion as church.

To Experience: When Jesus says, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments," we are confronted with the imperfection of our own love. How many times do we choose against God, in small things and in big ones? If our own salvation were determined by our own works, we would have no reason for hope. Thankfully, we rely on Christ's merits, and not our own. If we are to love Jesus, it is because he has already loved us first and offers us the grace to love him in return, even if imperfectly.

1. This week's responsorial psalm centers gratitude for the "tremendous deeds" that God has done. Where did you recognize God's action in the past week? How did you respond in the moment?

The Advocate and the Hidden Connection

In the Gospel today, Jesus moves us from a mystery of "He and the Father" to a mystery of "You and Me."

Last week, we marveled at the unity between Jesus and the Father. This week, Jesus brings us into that circle: "*You are in me and I am in you.*" This is not just a poetic thought; it is the blueprint for a life of faith in a world that often feels disconnected.

Jesus promises the Spirit of Truth, an Advocate to be with us always. Yet, he warns that the world "cannot accept" this Spirit because it neither sees nor knows Him.

In our current culture, we often see a clash between the "world's expectations" and the "logic of the Gospel": The world expects results that are visible, immediate, and material. If it can't be measured or bought, the world often ignores it. The Spirit works in the quiet, the interior, and the enduring. It is the "still, small voice" that guides us when the noise of the world is too loud.

Jesus defines love very practically: "*Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me.*" In a time where "faith" is often treated as a private opinion or a vague feeling, Jesus calls us to a visible love. To love Him is to act like Him—to forgive the "unforgivable," to serve the "unseen," and to stand for the truth even when it is unpopular.

The world is looking for hope but often looks in the wrong places. As followers of Christ, we are called to be the "evidence" of the Spirit. When we keep His commandments, we become the bridge through which the world might finally "see" the Spirit of Truth. When we live in Him, we don't just follow a religion; we live out a divine friendship that the world desperately needs to find.

May is a month devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary



Mary, Queen of Heaven

Over the years as a mom, I've learned that there are certain qualities that are very useful for parents to have. These include a sense of humor, the ability to multitask, and the knowledge of which battles to pick (note: forcing a toddler into pants he doesn't want to wear is the very definition of "lost cause"). As important as all these are, though, I think the most useful parental quality is faith.

What is faith? I'd define it as the ability to trust that there will be good things ahead. It's the knowledge that this moment—this cross-country flight with a screaming baby, this child's scary bout with pneumonia—is not the final chapter. Something good is waiting to happen. Often that something good is over a distant horizon, impossible to see from where we stand. Faith is the certainty that it is there all the same.

Every parent faces countless situations where faith is required. When I think of [Mary](#), it's clear that she was an expert in this area. She gave birth on the road; she had to escape to a foreign country for her baby's safety; she even lost her teenage son for a few terrifying days. When her child was an adult, she saw him saying things that hit a little too close to the bone of the powerful ones, who ended up killing him.

All of it must have taken extraordinary faith on Mary's part. And yet, even she must have been surprised and overjoyed at the exact nature of the good things that were finally revealed: a resurrection, eternal life, a fleet of devoted friends who would travel the globe to share the message of her son.

And [Mary](#) was no silent bystander. I love the image of Our Lady passing on her knowledge to the apostles. I imagine them in a semicircle around her, listening raptly to this middle-aged woman who knew details about Jesus that no one else knew. And I like to think that they also learned from her faith, the faith of a mother who faced countless frightening situations but who always believed that something good would happen. Perhaps her faith gave some of them the extra boost of courage that they needed to spread her son's story to the world.

Because that's the thing about faith: it can be wonderfully contagious. And, as Mary's story shows, one person's faith can change the world.

Some years ago, Life magazine featured Mary on its cover, and one comment in the accompanying article caught my attention. The text stated that one billion Hail Marys are prayed every day. Why? Because so many love our Blessed Mother, who gives us the joy in response to our hunger for it.

Aside from the serenity the prayer brings us, at times it even brings us joy.

Divine joy calms us down, invites us to rest in God and in the heart of Mary. This spirituality of joy is infinitely more satisfying than the sadness we encounter every day in empty promises.

Jesus felt that joy too. People praised his mother by saying, "Blessed is the womb that carried you." He replied, "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it" (Luke 11:27–28). Perhaps, what Jesus was saying is this: "The only one who has heard God's word and really kept it is my mom."

Prayer to Our Lady

Mary, guide us to serve in the ways of your son.
Give us the strength that you so often displayed
and help us to be living examples
of his message and to carry it to the world.

In our daily lives, help us to act with the courage
that you have modeled for us
and to face our challenges and obstacles
with the same faith.

In you, we see a shining example that all will be well
through your son.

Journey to the Heart of Christ

Recently an email arrived with a very simple, relatable message about prayer. It's a message that many can probably say, "I've been there." or "That's how I feel."

Be intentional. Make time to pray.
Give your attention to God.

Bringing Faith into Everyday Life

I used to think I needed the *perfect* conditions to pray—silence, a clean house, a clear mind. But most days, prayer looked more like whispered Hail Marys over a sink full of dishes or an exasperated "Bless them, change me", when I left a meeting that could have been an email. I wanted depth, but I kept offering God scraps of my attention and wondering why it felt so hard to enter in.

One day, almost out of frustration, I cleared off a tiny corner of my home. Nothing fancy, just a candle, a small crucifix, and a prayer card. Something shifted. Not because the space was magical, but because *I was finally being intentional*. I was telling the Lord, "You have a place here. You have my attention." It became an invitation.

The truth is, God is always ready for us. But we aren't always ready for Him. Creating a prayer space, even a small one, helps us step into that readiness. It quiets the noise just enough to remember: this is a relationship. This is a meeting. And He is truly present. Maybe today, it's not about finding more time to pray—but about making a space that helps you enter in fully, just as you are.

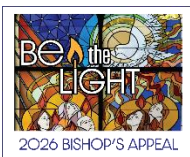
