Shout to God with Cries of Gladness

This week's Psalm 47 for the Ascension of Jesus really is filled with joy. As I sit here early in the morning with my coffee, I realize how much God has truly blessed me. I have so much to be thankful for.

Of course I'm thankful for the gift of my wife, children, and grandchildren. Hopefully, I have been a good caretaker for them for God the Father.

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: After several weeks of gospel readings from John in preparation for Jesus' return to the Father, we hear the ascension story told not in the gospel, but in the first reading from Acts. Here, it appears that the disciples are left with more questions than answers. They ask Jesus about the restoration of the kingdom of Israel and are given a nonanswer. As they see Jesus disappear from their sight, they're asked a question by two men (presumably angels), "Why are you standing there looking at the sky?" In combination with today's gospel, this question looks increasingly rhetorical. Jesus has given them other things to be doing rather than looking at the sky and waiting for his return: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." This "great commission" gives the disciples a decisive direction after Jesus' disappearance, all with the promise of Jesus' continued presence with them.



To Experience: Of all the feasts commemorating Jesus' life, the Ascension seems exceptionally hard to apply to our lives. Rather than an acknowledgement of distance, as we might think, this feast is instead a celebration of nearness. By returning to the Father, Jesus completes what he began at his birth. Jesus took on our human nature in the incarnation, redeemed us in his death and resurrection, and now in the ascension, Jesus bring our own humanity into the inner life of the Trinity, Creator and creation now inextricably bound together. In the gospel reading, Jesus promises to be with us to the end of the age but also desires that we be in his loving embrace for eternity, in union with the Father and Holy Spirit.

I'm also grateful for my health. Yes, there was a scare on Easter weekend, but I am grateful for the care I am receiving. I also want to thank all of you for your prayers. They do work because I'm still with you and things could have turned out a lot worse. This also proved to my children that their dad does have a heart!

I am thankful to God for our pastor, Father Josuva. Fr. Josuva allows us to see ourselves from a different perspective. He cares so deeply for our parishes. He truly wants us to grow in faith and holiness.

I am also so grateful to our parishioners. The donations to the Good Samaritan Fund at St. Gregory exceeded expectations. This fund will be a way for us to meet the needs of parishioners and to hopefully one day spread the Gospel, into our greater Mission Field. If you find yourself in need, please don't be afraid to call the St Gregory Parish office for details, and it is confidential.

I am grateful for all the volunteers in our parishes. To all of you who serve on councils, lector, serve at Mass, teach, lead study groups, plan and help with fundraisers, fix things, and serve in so many other ways, your help is what keeps our parishes healthy and alive. We have a great parish staff who do so much to keep the wheels turning, and they serve with the heart of Christ.

I am grateful to the Holy Spirit who has given us a sudden surge in people returning to the Catholic Church. All of us should be inspired by their desire to revitalize their relationship with Christ.

I am grateful for the ability to be an agent for Christ and to be able to administer His Sacraments in His person through the power of the Holy Spirit. There is nothing more exciting for me than baptizing a child, especially if that child is your grandchild, or to be the officiant at the Sacrament of Matrimony.

In this day and age, it is so easy to get taken down into the rabbit hole of negativity. These are some of the things I am grateful for. What is it you are grateful for today? What fills you with joy? Look at the positive things going on all around and, "Clap your hands and shout joy to God with cries of gladness." Let sing a joyful hymn of praise to God.

Second Collection: Our Own Needs May 23 & 24

Next week, we will take up the Home Missions – Our Own Needs collection, which supports the Black and Indian Missions, Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC), Catholic University of America, and Catholic Home Missions dioceses. This consolidated collection helps the Church evangelize in the US, including here in the Diocese of Green Bay. Your support helps the Church spread the gospel message and form many in their faith.

- Black and Indian Missions: build Christian communities among the African American, Native American, and Alaskan Native peoples. All funds collected are distributed as diocesan grants.
- Catholic Communications Campaign: modernize how the church communicates the joy of the Gospel. Half the funds remain in the diocese to support local communication efforts and half support USCCB's communication projects.
- Catholic University of America: enables the university to prepare the next generation of Catholic leadership, both religious and lay. All funds donated are used to assist students completing their education.
- Catholic Home Missions: assists 40% of Dioceses in the US; provides assistance for Mass, the sacraments, and faith formation to Dioceses' facing fragile financial situations, poverty, vast distances, difficult terrain, and lack of priests.

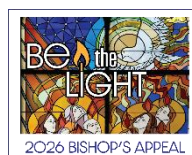

Witness Story

My husband, Ron, and I along with our 2 children moved to Kiel in 2001. During the past 25 years, we being no different than anyone else, have had our heartaches, struggles, and tragedies. However, also over these years, God has brought me closer and closer to Him. He allowed me to stumble and fall and welcomed me back with open arms. Never did He leave my side and never did a prayer go unanswered.

I learned prayer doesn't need to be perfect. I learned that prayer is learning to love Jesus more fully and to have Him at the center of all you think, say, and do throughout the day. I learned that his timing is perfect and does not always align with mine...in fact it rarely does...

Prayer has a place in every moment of our lives. By starting my day with prayer I have come to realize I am setting the stage for a peace-filled day. And, when my mind wanders and I start focusing on something not pure or good, a simple "Help Me Jesus" or "I praise you Jesus" can quickly bring your center back...and that center is Jesus.

We all have a story. We all had or currently have our challenges in life. Whether illness, addiction, financial burdens, or anger issues, we all have a story. Today I would like to share one that has been the most impactful in my life.

Ron and my 37-year-old son has Tourette's and after high school began abusing the use of marijuana (he thought it helped his tics). All okay, according to him, until it wasn't. You see marijuana can interact horribly with some people's minds. Psychotic breaks are horrifying and my son had several.

Late one evening, during his last episode, a friend of his picked him up for a joy ride. I sprung out of bed to grab him and prevent him from going (although physically I knew I couldn't stop him). My husband put his arm across my chest and pushed me back down in bed and said "TRUST GOD!" And I did...and we prayed. That evening he was in a one car accident, was brought to the hospital, and later put in Winnebago Mental Health Institute. Here, there was one nurse who finally got through to him that marijuana was not the answer and if he had another break, we may never get him back.

We continued to send him letters, prayer cards and then there was the prayer from my own Mother:

Dear Luke,

When I go to bed there is a little prayer I would like to share with you. Say it at night.

God cares for you – Imagine God has tucked you in. Pulled the covers to your chin. Then as you rest remember too just how much He cares for you. I love you. xo Grandma

He continued to heal and we continued to pray. He is now a successful 1st shift production lead, married, and smart...really smart! He is SO loved by bosses, coworkers, us and of course GOD! My son stumbled and fell but he was welcomed back to Jesus with open arms.

On this particular evening and over the years I have become more aware of my responses to life's challenges and the power of prayer. In the worst of circumstances I allow myself to still be sad and scared. However, I also know that God has and will continue to work every situation for

good...in His timing. I no longer ask "why me" or "why them" for I know we may not know the plan, but we can know and trust Jesus.

As I humbly speak to you today, know that this is not about ME! It is about YOU! It is about recognizing how prayer is now a part of your life and how sharing your own prayer journey can be encouraging to others.

Before I began speaking today and before I read at Mass I ask the Holy Spirit to fill me with all I need to project the joy of Jesus Christ. I hope I have done that today for I have Faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, I Trust in His goodness, grace and mercy, and I am forever grateful and will sing His praises always for He listens to my every prayer and, He listens to yours too.
