## From the Well to the World – The Journey of the Samaritan Woman

In today's Gospel, we witness one of the most beautiful and instructional conversations. The encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman at Jacob's Well is not just a historical event; it is a **roadmap for our own spiritual growth.**

Throughout the world, parishes run Faith Formation activities for young and adult people. What is the goal of Faith Formation? It is to gradually lead a person to a deeper understanding of who Jesus Christ is and what he means in our lives. It is a step-by-step journey of growing in faith, love, and commitment to follow more closely each day.

As we reflect on their dialogue, we see the woman move through four distinct stages of faith. It is a kind of Faith Formation activity.

Initially, she sees Jesus only as a stranger, calling Him **"Sir."** She views Him through the lens of social barriers and physical needs.

As Jesus speaks truth into her life with compassion, her eyes are opened. She realizes He is no ordinary man and acknowledges Him as a **"Prophet."**

The conversation deepens, and the woman's curiosity turns to hope. She discovers that the one speaking to her is the **Messiah**, the one who fulfills all longings.

Transformation leads to mission. She leaves her water jar behind—symbolizing her old life—and brings her community to Christ. Together, they proclaim Him as the **"Savior of the World."**

Like the Samaritan woman, we often come to the "wells" of modern life—our careers, social media, or material comforts—seeking to quench a thirst that never quite goes away.

This week, Jesus meets us at our own wells. He invites us to move past "surface-level" faith and enter into a deeper relationship with Him. He doesn't just offer us a better life; He offers us **Living Water**—the Holy Spirit—which becomes a spring within us, welling up to eternal life.

## Thoughts for Today's Readings

**To the Point:** In this gospel reading, Jesus shares the "good news" not by preaching to a crowd or working great miracles, but by encountering a Samaritan woman in conversation. She draws water during the heat of the day, hoping to avoid the sneering glances of others in her community. Instead, she encounters the loving gaze of Jesus. In seeing Jesus for who he is, the Son of God, the Samaritan woman comes to know herself more truly. The Word of God reveals to her and to each of us our own deepest identity as beloved children of God. Despite our sin, fear and shame, God sees in us his own image, perfected by grace in Christ Jesus. Carried by this truth, she reveals Jesus to her whole community, who come to believe. Jesus desires to offer his "living water," his own Holy Spirit. In receiving this Spirit into our hearts, we ourselves become "wells" of living water for others.

**To Experience:** God desires to meet us where we are, even at times when we're actively avoiding God and others, like the woman in today's gospel. Whether we think we're too underserving of God's love or whether we think we can make it through life without it, at times we cut ourselves off from God's free offer of grace, building walls and wearing masks. God sees us as we are and loves us, and, breaking through the barriers we put up, asks us to see ourselves as he does.

1. Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman has a remarkable impact. Where can you recognize Jesus' presence in recent conversations you've had? What is Jesus desiring to show us?
2. Where do you need Jesus' "living water" in this next week? What kind of transformation could this make?






